- ◆ AAOHN News: The revised AAOHN Competencies for Occupational and Environmental Health Nursing was accepted and approved by the Board of Directors in May 2003. The July 2003 issue of the AAOHN Journal Vol. 51, number 7, includes this document. The AAOHN has developed nine categories of competency with three levels of achievement (competent, proficient and expert) within each category.

- ◆ Diet and Breast Cancer: According to the WHO, more than 1.2 million people will be diagnosed with breast cancer this year, 40,000 will die this year. The study of more than 90,000 women aged 26 to 46 was taken from the Nurses' Health Study. That data was analyzed by tracking the women's health over the eight years of the study. 714 women developed invasive breast cancer. The study provides yet another incentive for women to shun fatty foods and consume fresh fruits, vegetables and whole grains. The study was unique because it included women who had not reached menopause indicating that factors early in a woman's life may be important.
- ◆ABIH/CIH News: For anyone planning on taking the CIH exam after 2003 the ABIH website is currently indicating that ABIH is planning to offer examinations by computer at various locations beginning in 2004. Exams are NOT planned for the 2004 AIHCE in Atlanta.
