◆ 2007 NASA Safety Directors / Occupational Health Managers Meeting is Almost Here: Just a reminder to make your hotel reservations at the Cocoa Beach Doubletree to attend the annual Safety Directors/Occupational Health Managers Meeting. ◆ A New Resource from the Mayo Clinic - EmbodyHealth: EmbodyHealth will be launched on January 30, 2007. The private web



portal offers a wealth of information including a Health Risk Assessment tool, Ask an Expert, Diseases and Conditions, and Healthful Recipes. To access the site, participants will require a valid email address and a password. Mayo Clinic EmbodyHealth is for CS and families only. Detailed instructions including a unique ID will be sent to all CS on January 30. Basic instructions are available on the OH website.

- ◆ EHRS Update: It is only January and the EHRS Project is already wearing green. Federal executive agencies are judged by the President's Management Agenda (PMA) stoplight scorecards and health information technology (HIT) was added to the PMA scorecard in December 2006. HIT for NASA received green ratings for both current status and progress in our first assessment. The EHRS Project accomplishments are positioning the Agency's EHRS as a model for other federal agencies to use in their efforts to comply with the PMA. Once operational, the EHRS will promote patient safety, reduce errors, maximize utilization of limited health care resources, and provide data for effectively measuring the efficacy of services. It cannot be emphasized enough how important the PMA scorecard is to the agency. Recently a communication bannered "EHRS Training Plan" was broadcast to the EHRS Task Force, Medical COTRs, and other EHRS stakeholders.
