◆ 2007 NASA Occupational Health Conference -Registration is Open and Agenda is Posted:



The annual NASA Occupational Health Conference will be held in scenic Denver, CO from July 23 – 27, at the Warwick Hotel. This year's conference theme is "Moving Toward the Summit: Occupational Health Challenges." Online registration for the conference has begun and the agenda and letter of invitation from Dr. Richard Williams is now posted. Please make sure you complete the entire conference registration, including the courses and events you want to attend. You can always modify the information you have provided at a later date if your plans change. Hotel registration is separate and you can call the hotel directly (303-861-2000 or 800-525-2888) or use CI Travel to make reservations. In either case, indicate that you are attending the 2007 NASA Occupational Health Conference to guarantee the government rate of \$127.00/day plus tax. All reservations must be received by Friday, June 29. Reservations made after the deadline will be subject to space and rate availability. ◆ Mayo Clinic EmbodyHealth Update: Mayo Clinic will be presenting an analysis of the Health Risk Assessment (HRA) data during our next Health Promotion ViTS, scheduled for June 6, at 1:00 PM EDT. Please allow 1.25 hours for this ViTS as Dr. Saralyn Mark will also be discussing HPV (Human Papillomavirus). Mayo Clinic Book of Business proposes a 15-20% participation rate for a like business that is geographically diverse. Our goal is at least 3,000 completed HRAs based on 15,000 civil servants. Mayo Clinic EmbodyHealth will be available to all civil servants and contractor OH personnel, their spouse and children over the age of 18, through January 20, 2008.
