♦ NASA OH Conference 2008 Update: Registration is open for the 2008 NASA Occupational Health Conference. The theme this year is *The Past: Key to Navigating the Future* and speakers throughout the week will talk about how the past affects our future in Occupational Health. The full agenda is online and features a broad range of Occupational Health speakers from government, academia, private corporations, and NASA. The Conference will be held in the Inner Harbor area of Baltimore, MD, at the Radisson Plaza Lord Baltimore hotel during the week of July 7-11. Each individual guest must make their own reservations by calling the hotel's toll free number 1-800-333-3333. All attendees must identify themselves as a participant attending the 2008 NASA OH Conference. Hotel room rate is \$155.00 + tax (government room rate). Last date to reserve rooms at the conference rate is *Friday June 13, 2008*.

◆ Special Ergonomic Session at OH Conference:

There will be a special Ergonomic Session at the OH Conference this year that will focus on sharing information between Centers regarding their



respective Ergonomic Programs. Centers will be asked to provide short presentations on the status of their ergonomic program and bring written policies, procedures, and forms (job analysis) to share with other attendees. The session will be on Tuesday evening, July 8th, hosted by Miriam Glazer.
