

◆ Judge Rules In Favor of ACGIH® in Lawsuit: In a summary judgment ruling issued on May 6, 2008, a federal judge in the US District Court in Macon, GA dismissed the last of four counts in a lawsuit against ACGIH® initiated by the International Brominated Solvents Association (IBSA), National Mining Association (NMA), and other plaintiffs. Three counts had been previously dismissed in March, 2005. This represents a major victory for ACGIH® and, particularly the occupational and environmental health community.
