◆ EHRS Announcement: Earlier in June, Dr. Richard S. Willams announced the procurement of an Electronic Health Record System (EHRS) for the Agency. This represents a major milestone for the NASA EHRS Project. The selected EHRS is an integrated Occupational Health (OH) software with both medical and environmental health modules. A demonstration of the EHRS will be provided by Medgate at the EHRS Breakout Session and the Industrial Hygiene (IH) Breakout Session at the 2008 NASA OH Conference in Baltimore, Maryland. The EHRS Project Team has participated in two teleconferences with Medgate to discuss the preparations for an initial face to face meeting in August. The meeting with Medgate will be a Gap Analysis and Implementation Planning meeting with participation from the EHRS Project Team and field Center representation. In preparation for this meeting the clinic work flow process documentation will continue. The roster of Agency EHRS Task Force members will be updated with input from the Medical COTRs. A survey of the data conversion requirements from existing electronic systems at the Centers is being conducted to identify the type and volume of records needing conversion to the * medgate new system.

Thanks to everyone who has contributed to this project and we look forward to your continued support as we begin the implementation stage. Please check the <u>EHRS webpage</u> for future updates.
