"A New Facility, Better Service - Princeton Town Hall"

Outline of Need:

Serving a population of approximately 1,200, the Town of Princeton operations occurred within the walls of a 58 year old building that was inadequate to house the necessary personnel of the Town and the Police Department. Even though the building had several face-lifts over the years, the roof still leaked and the building did not have a storage or evidence room. With maintenance problems and hazards becoming insurmountable, the only solution was to build a new town hall.

How Rural Development Helped:

Through USDA Rural Development's Community Facilities Program, the Town of Princeton was awarded a grant in the amount of \$300,000 and a low interest loan of \$600,000. Rural Development's funding allowed the Town of Princeton to purchase land, upon which to construct the new town hall and enhance the Police Department's ability to service the citizens of Princeton.

The Results:

The new facility provided adequate space for the Town Hall employees and Police Department, as well as a new secure evidence room. The Town Hall was dedicated to the service of the citizens of Princeton and to ensure that Princeton remains, as their mission
