




- On September 29, 2006, there were 6,681 inmates being housed in a facility managed by the Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP) following adjudication in DC Superior Court. The states with the highest population of DC offenders were North Carolina (1,176) Pennsylvania (1,165), and West Virginia (855).
- Ninety-five percent (6,377) were males. The leading three states housing male inmates were North Carolina (1,176), Pennsylvania (1,127) and West Virginia (811).
- Five percent (304) were females. The leading three states housing female inmates were Connecticut (129), West Virginia (44) and Pennsylvania (38).

NOTE: This fact sheet does not include 419 inmates who were in-transit to or from a BOP facility.
