



#### **Selected State Evaluation Findings**

- □ Based on data collected over a 5-year period (2002–2003 school year to 2006–2007 school year), a composite of Reading First schools has risen an average of 3.4 points per year equivalent to 17 points over 5 years.
- Based on data collected over a 5-year period (2002–2003 school year to 2006–2007 school year), Reading First improves grade 4 performance: Progress gained during the K–3 program continues in the 4th grade in Reading First schools with students gaining an average of 4.1 points in comparison to the 2.4 point average across non-participating schools.
- ☐ From 2002–2003 to 2006–2007, Reading First schools show higher achievement gains than all non-Reading First schools for grades 2–4 and Reading First schools show higher achievement gains than what would be predicted from a statistical control group for grades 2–4.
- ☐ Reading First Schools out-perform the control group: Reading First schools performed 1.6 points per year better than the control group (from 2002–2003 to 2006–2007). An equivalent to 8 points over 5 years.
- □ Based on data collected over a 5-year period (2002-2003 school year to 2006-2007 school year), high implementing Reading First schools show higher achievement gains than low implementing Reading First schools for grades 2–4.
