




#### **Selected State Evaluation Findings**

- □ According to 2007 data, for the 2006 start-year schools, student reading proficiency increased by an average of 25 percentage points across 14 different skill areas. Student proficiency in the 2003 start-year schools increased on average by 17 percentage points across 12 measured skill areas.
- According to 2007 data, achievement gaps for students with limited English proficiency from 2006 start-year schools narrowed on 11 of 12 measures, and widened by 4 percentage points for second grade BRI comprehension.
- According to 2007 data, achievement gaps for students with disabilities in both 2005 and 2006 start-year schools narrowed for 5 out of 12 measures and widened on 7 of 12 measures.
