


Round 1 schools—completing their third year of implementation in 2006–2007—made sustained 2008 \$935.641 increases in the percentage of students at benchmark. Changes from spring 2006 to spring 2007 were statistically significant in kindergarten and first and second grades. 2007 \$2,463,421 Round 2 schools—completing their first year of implementation in 2006–2007—also saw increases in the percentage of students at benchmark from baseline to the end of their first year. Changes from 2006 \$2.469.053 spring 2006 to spring 2007 were statistically significant in first, second, and third grades, but not in 2005 \$2,490,935 kindergarten.
