#### **CHECKLIST**

All required items must be sent to my Austin office postmarked by **Friday, October 16, 2009**. **Incomplete applications will not be considered for nomination.** For delivery verification, you may wish to request a return receipt from the Post Office.

APPLICATION FORM AND RESUME completed and <b>signed</b> by applicant. This must be typed or legibly written.
PERSONAL QUESTIONNAIRE AND ESSAY thoroughly completed. Due to the volume of applicants, I am not able to conduct personal interviews. This questionnaire, along with the information provided on the application, is your best opportunity to demonstrate your strengths and character.
PERSONAL RECOMMENDATION FORMS (3) completed by counselors, principals, teachers, religious leaders (i.e. priests, rabbis, and ministers), coaches, or community leaders. You are required to return a minimum of three (3) Personal Recommendation Forms by the postmark deadline; these forms may be accompanied by written letters of recommendation from your recommenders. Up to two (2) additional letters of recommendation (with or without forms) may be submitted for your application packet. Letters in excess of this number will not be reviewed. <b>NOTE</b> : Recommendation Forms are the chief cause of delays in completing an application packet. Start this process now to ensure that they are postmarked by the deadline.
OFFICIAL COPY OF HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT including courses currently in progress, GPA through junior year, and class rank. If you would like to provide your transcript from your senior year, you may send it as an update as long as your application is complete by October 16, 2009.
OFFICIAL COPY OF COLLEGE TRANSCRIPT (if applicable) including courses currently in progress and GPA.
CURRENT PHOTOGRAPH (wallet size) with your name and hometown written on the back.
□ COPY OF OFFICIAL SAT/ACT SCORES if they are not being sent directly from the college boards. <b>NOTE:</b> Test scores must be postmarked by October 16, 2009. Carefully consider the dates that you aretaking tests; if you wait until September your scores may not arrive on time. Upcoming SAT and ACT national testing dates can be found on the following page. My score report codes are: SAT: 6263, ACT:7185
Remember that it is in your best interest to apply for a nomination with <b>both</b> of your U.S. Senators, your U.S.Representative and the Vice President. Each office has its own application procedures; contact each office for information.

### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

#### **SAT and ACT Test Dates**

Standardized test scores are important elements of your application. In order for your application to be considered complete, you must either send an official copy of your scores or have the testing centers send your scores to my office. The codes for my office are: **SAT: 6263, ACT: 7185**. To meet this deadline, I suggest taking one or both of the tests on these dates:

<u>SAT</u> May 2, 2009 June 6, 2009 ACT April 4, 2009 June 13, 2009 September 12, 2009

\*Note: All test scores must be postmarked by **October 16, 2009**. However, your test scores can be updated between the time of your application and the time of the Academy Board meeting if you score higher on a later test; this will only be permitted for students who submit their first score(s) on or before the official deadline to complete their files.

6. Do you understand that, if selected, you must commit to a minimum of five years in military service? Do you plan to pursue a career in military service? Are there any specialized fields that interest you?
7. Do you think you can abide by an honor code? How do you think you would react if you were aware that a peer or even a close friend was guilty of an honor code violation?

In a brief essay (approximately 300 words), please answer the following question: What is unique about your personality, character, or talent that makes you stand out from the hundreds of students competing for a nomination? When answering this question, please keep in mind that the members of the selection board

will not have the opportunity to interact with you in person and that this is their only opportunity to distinguish you from other candidates. Also, please remember that you are competing against hundreds of

Each student must submit three personal evaluation forms, along with a complete application packet, by October 16, 2009. Please keep this deadline in mind as you return this form to the applicant, along with any additional pages or letters, sealed in an envelope and signed across the flap. Please answer the SPECIFIC QUESTIONS asked on this form, and use additional pages if necessary. You are welcome to submit a recommendation letter; however, it will NOT be accepted as a substitute for this completed form.
