I have been so totally fortunate in being able to have the wonder drug "Gleevec" prescribed for my CML. I also feel I am getting excellent care - and have a very good doctor who is in constant contact with the Gleevec doctors in Seattle. I am in the pro I have listened to the advice of my oncologist + have follow up with colonoscopies. I have blood tests every 6 mos before I visit the Dr.

I never felt that I was a cancer patient. As a result, I do not consider myself a "survivor." You should realize that I had a bladder surgery to remove a polyp. This polyp, upon pathological examination, was determined to be malignant. There was no fu I never thought of having the cancer in the first place. I take one thing at a time - enjoy life, eat good food - lots of fruits + vegetables + take my medicine for hypertension + diabetes.

I realized how much confidence and how much I must trust I need to give my doctor. I also have little idea what my CLL will do and neither does my doctor.

I really don't think of myself as a cancer survivor. I got a very odd type of tumor + there's no group of "SFT-of-the-bladder" to identify with. So I'd say what helped me was surgery + then going back to normal.

I received a lot of help from my doctors and especially from the staff on Encology. They were so very supportive.

I recommend colonoscopy before symptoms appear, when M.D. advises to have one.

I do not worry about cancer returning or cancer treatment. I worry a lot about the treatment related side-effects - Graft vs. Host Disease + fatigue.

I do recognise that I had to be very "assertive" (pushy!) with my health org to schedule surgery promptly. This factor doesn't seem the target of your study

I feel both my oncologist and GI doctor are very educated and skilled. They're also very busy, and sometimes their brusque manner makes it intimidating to ask questions for clarification.

I feel good participating in this survey, though (fortunately) my own episode with bladder cancer was much easier to deal with than other more serious and life-threatening cancer cases. The questions were good, clearly presented, and though-provoking.

I feel some questions were not necessary - hope they give you something to work by!

I feel that my Dr. caught this early on & contribute this to my being cancer free from then on.

I feel that not enough research is being conducted in this area of cancer (nor money put into research of course) - Certainly not proportional to breast cancer. I would like to know if there is any way to encourage research into urological cancers.

I feel that the term, "My doctor", no longer is appropriate. We no longer have ties to one doctor. Our doctors are a composite of the specialization of many doctors. I have reason to believe that I am not alone in this belief.

I feel that you have to trust your doctor 100%. If you doubt, get another doctor. Go to a different hospital, but always have faith. (easier said than done)

I feel you have covered more than enough in this Booklet and it has been my pleasure filling this information in for you.

I first had bladder cancer 5/16/01. I was unhappy with my first oncologist so when it was discovered on 9-03 that I might have bone cancer I switched doctors.

I get excellent care by all concerned.

I had an infusion pump inserted because colon cancer spread to the liver. The chemo treatment went directly to the liver saving me from usual chemo side effects. Wonderful treatment.

I had colon cancer. Dr. Henry removed all the cancer and I did not need any after treatments at all. Praise God.

I had surgery to remove my spleen because my platelets was very low. They are now much better, but still low.

I have Diabetes, Primary Biliary Cirrhosis, Arthritis - All of which have their own symptoms & side effects I found some questions dual edged

I have sinus really bad, so when my sinus get bad I worry about my cancer because that how it started out, like as sinus infection I hope it can help anyone.

I hope it helps.

I hope that I have answered most of your questions since I had cancer 3 years ago.

I just can't say enough nice things about my oncologist and the chemo and infusion nurses. They are saints. But I can't say the same for the surgeon in my case or the colonoscopy staff. When I was first diagnosed, she, the GI doctor, left a curt message

I just want to mention that the "pain" accompanied w/ cancer-treatment is similar to what I've experienced all my life (probable Fibromyalgia)

I like to present a brief- my cancer gene in my family. My elder sister- died of cancer lung. younger brother die of multiple Myeloma. My youngest son died of cancer rectum and myself cancer colon. About cancer gene in my family.

I lived 40 years in Argentina. Families had a family doctor you could totally trust. Don't fool yourself the existing health insurance system prevents Doctors from being there best!!!

I received surgery in a teaching hospital MARTINEZ County and it wasn't until over a year had passed that I learned that they left surgical clamps inside me.

I still feel pain during urination, almost 3 years after surgery. This is in the urethra, and was created by surgical equipment & catheter. Dr's response was "you will get used to it." No one prepared me for the lasting pain & discomfort from surgery.

Make wording of questions easier to understand. Due to my decline in ability to focus and remember what I read (since treatment) some questions I had to read several times before understanding.

Many of my answers (especially under F and G) are influenced by treatments I have been taking for liver disease (Hepatitis C). I just completed 24 weeks taking interferon, ribavirin, and zoloft (for depression).

Many of my answers were influenced by the fact that I was diagnosed with recurrent cancer in the exact same location just last week. My radiation & chemo treatments start next week & will continue for 7 weeks to be followed by surgery.

Many of my questionnaire answers are unrelated to cancer / and the treatment I received but are responses due to other medical problems

Many of the health problems I have now are not directly related to cancer but to the after effects of a BMT. People who have had a transplant have a very different set of health problems, many related to GVHD (graft vs. host disease). Maybe there should

Many of the questions were double negative. I had to read several time to make sure I answered the right way.

More lengthy than I anticipated. Questions contedict each other

Much too lengthy - No space to state other problem's results such as asthma and emphysema.

My Medical Doc. was very unprofessional when my cancer recurred he kept telling me I had developed hemroids and also even said he could see them hanging out - A Big Fat Lie

My Urinealysis test results always show "Attipia" Every 3 months I go in for a scope & Urine Test.

My cancer has been reoccurring - but never let to become invasive - due to regular check ups.

My cancer was found in a polyp & had not spread beyond the top - I feel very lucky to have been told at age 50 to get a routine colonoscopy & have the Dr. (a gyn) insist on the test. It was scary but not as serious as other cancers I have heard about. E

My concern with Kaiser. After Kemo treatments my Kemo treatments my membership had expired. Re-applies for personal coverage, but was turned down because of previous cancer & Kaiser was where I had my surgery. I re-applied thinking it had to be a mistske,

My current poor state of health and health problems are not related to the cancer I had.

My experience spans over 3 years. Not much has changed in the last 2 years since the coral has done its work. I only use the doctors now for tracking blood levels, etc.

My first gastroenterologist & a few others (I.e. friends) acted as if they felt sorry for me. I did not want or appreciate this. I did not feel sorry for myself. I do not like when people say, " How are you" with that "head felt" as if cancer is imminent.

My follow up care doctor was an oncologist. My second opinion follow up care doctor. She is great & so is the Palo Alto Medical Foundation.

My follow-up care is to have a colonoscopy every 1-2 year - so for this survey, there wasn't much to respond to regarding regularity of follow up care (beyond "within 12 months")

My form of cancer is extremely rare. I feel as if my oncologist at Kaiser is not very informed about metatistic carcinoid & also about alternative treatments

My greatest concern is always that the cancer will return - I know that it will someday. Perhaps not for 20 years, but it probably will. It is the most insidious disease - I'm just not going to waste any life worrying about it and keep living!

My health insurance has been Kaiser and they were not able to diagnosticate my cancer. A private cusmetic doctor/surgent did.

My husband and I have a private health insurance where we each pay \$9000 per year deductible - and they won't pay office visits. We also pay them over \$3000 quarterly + the bill goes up every single quarter! Insurance + working with them is disgusting!!

My nervousness and depression and fear of the future (pgs. 35 + 36) are due to having Alzheimer's.

Since in my case the polps & portion of intestine were removed before cancer spread most of this survey does not apply to me.

Some feedback about the questions and their applicability to me...1) I learned that I had cancer only immediately after the surgery that removed the tumor. Thus I did not have to live with the knowledge that I had cancer, while I had it. 2) I suffer from Some of my answers included my living with RF.
