IG Academy Facilitators

The Inspector General Criminal Investigator Academy routinely utilizes facilitators who act as mentors during training programs and assist students in the overall learning process. These individuals are experienced criminal investigators from the Inspector General community whose agency has agreed to support the IG Academy's training programs. The experience is beneficial to the facilitator, the students and the IG Academy staff.

The IG Academy funds facilitator travel costs. Facilitators should have 7 or more years of criminal investigator experience and at least five years in an OIG. Graduation from the Criminal Investigator Training Program (CITP) and either the IG-ITP or the IG-Transitional Training Program (IG_TTP) are also prerequisites.

All of our FY09 training programs are currently fully staffed with facilitators.
