

Consumer Health Information Workshops for Public Librarians

Prescription for Success: Consumer Health Information on the Internet



This introduction to consumer health information covers the informationseeking behaviors of

consumers, MedlinePlus.gov, DIRLINE, ClinicalTrials.gov and other reliable web pages, such as those from professional medical associations and advocacy groups. It also covers sites devoted to pharmaceutical information for consumers, drug-interaction databases and herbal information.



Looking in all the Wrong Places: **PubMed for Public Librarians**

PubMed is a bibliographic database of journal citations covering all aspects of medicine. This class covers basic and field searching, journal browser, single citation matcher, clipboard, history, and other features. It also covers how to obtain fulltext articles.



From Snake Oil to Penicillin: **Evaluating Consumer Health** Information on the Internet

This course explains why it is important to evaluate websites and medical research data used to make health benefit claims. Participants will be given criteria for how to evaluate health information on the Internet.

Beyond an Apple a Day: **Providing Consumer** Health Information in a **Public Library**



This class covers the information-seeking behaviors of consumers, addresses the recommended core reference collection, as well as databases and newsletters/ periodicals. It will examine the reference interview, disclaimers, and privacy issues, as well as networking with medical librarians. The class will introduce students to the Medical Library Association and its local chapters. It will describe possible ways to market your consumer health resources to your community.
