
# Q & A Evacuation and Shelter Training Refresher

What would you do if you encountered smoke in the hallway while you were trying to exit the building?



Get as low to the floor as possible and get out.



What would you do if you saw fire or smoke in your building?



- Activate the fire alarm system by "pulling" a fire alarm pull station.
- Call 911 (on campus) or 9-911 (off campus)
   and ensure that co-workers are evacuating.



What would you do if you were trapped in a room during a fire?



Block bottom of door with any type of cloth
Use phone, if available, to call 911 or 9-911
If there is an outside window available, climb out
if possible or use a bright material to draw
attention to anyone looking up or write HELP on
a piece of paper

What is the purpose of a fire door?



To keep the fire confined to an area behind the door. Usually found in "zoned" facilities such as the clinical center.



What does this exit sign tell you?



The exit is at the right or left of the sign.



When talking about fire extinguishers, what does P.A.S.S. stand for?



Р	Pull safety pin from handle
Δ	Aim at base of fire
s	Squeeze the trigger handle
S	Sweep from side to side at base of fire

#### Shelter-In-Place



Give me one reason that lockdown would take place in your building?



Armed intruder
Gunshots heard
Loud commotion or shouting outside or near your office/lab

What should you do during a

tornado?



Get to nearest hardened facility (not trailer/mobile home)

Once inside - stay away from windows


Outside: get into a ditch or low lying area, lay flat and cover head and neck

Be especially careful after the tornado. Be on the lookout for downed power lines, broken glass and gas leaks

What would you say a suspicious package/object might look like?











Mail that has no return address.

Mail addressed only to title of prospective recipient or using an incorrect title.

Misspelled words or defective address.

Restrictive markings such as "confidential" or "personal for."

Stains, discoloration, oiliness, crystallization, or strange odor.

Wires, metal foil, or string protruding.

Unusually heavy or unbalanced.

Anything unusual or out of place.

Unclaimed article such as a briefcase or backpack.




No clear exit Less than 54 inches of clearance Clutter on one or both sides of halfway





Do you see what the problem is here?


