

NIA IRP BBP EXPOSURE

(As simple as 1 – 2 – 3)

1. FIRST AID PROCEDURES

- ❖ Contaminated Non-intact Skin
Clean the area for 15 minutes using soap or povidone iodine (such as Betadine) and copious amounts of water. If allergic to iodine, use either chlorhexidine (Hibiclens) or 70 % isopropyl alcohol.
- ❖ Contaminated intact skin
Wash thoroughly with soap and water for 15 minutes
- ❖ Contaminated eyes and mucous membranes.
Irrigate for 15 minutes with water.

2. NOTIFICATION

The employee notifies the supervisor of exposure to human BBP as soon as possible. Either the supervisor or the employee must notify the Safety Officer.

- Call the Clinical Center Operator at Bethesda.

- Ask the Operator to page an OMS physician immediately. You should get a response within 15 minutes. If not call the number a second time.
- Tell the physician you're at the GRC in Baltimore and you have a potential BBP exposure.
- If you decide to begin taking the Post Exposure Prophylaxis medication give the NIH OMS on-call physician the phone number of the nearest 24 hour pharmacy listed below. The OMS physician will call in the prescription, which you will need to pick-up.
