


Estradiol Levels in Natural and Surgical Menopause


Age vs. Estradiol in Women

Testosterone Levels in Naturally and Surgically Menopausal Women








Declines in Cognitive Function with Estrogen Loss



Criteria for Major Depressive Episode

- 1) Depressed mood most of the day.....
- 2) Markedly diminished interest or pleasure....
- 3) Significant weight loss or gain
- 4) Insomnia or hypersomnia
- 5) Psychomotor agitation or retardation ...
- 6) Fatigue or loss of energy ...
- 7) Feelings of worthlessness or guilt ...
- 8) Diminished ability to think or concentrate
- 9) Recurrent thoughts of death ...
