Purpose of Amendment: To revise Section L.2. Instructions to Offerors, item (12)a), in the RFP.

The following change is hereby made to the solicitation:

2. INSTRUCTIONS TO OFFERORS

(12) Past Performance Information

- a) Offerors shall submit the following information as part of their business proposal.

A list of the five most relevant contracts completed during the past three years and all contracts currently in process that are similar in nature to the solicitation workscope. Contracts listed may include those entered into by the Federal Government, agencies of state and local governments and commercial concerns. Offerors that are newly formed entities without prior contracts should list contracts and subcontracts as required above for all key personnel.

Include the following information for each contract or subcontract:

1. Name of Contracting Organization
2. Contract Number (for subcontracts, provide the prime contract number and the subcontract number)
3. Contract Type
4. Total Contract Value
5. Description of Requirement
6. Contracting Officer's Name and Telephone Number
7. Program Manager's Name and Telephone Number
8. NAICS Code

The offeror shall submit comparable information on all subcontractors that the offeror proposes to perform a major subcontract under this effort. For the purpose of this solicitation, a "major subcontract" is defined as a subcontract over \$550,000.

The offeror may provide information on problems encountered on the identified contracts and the offeror's corrective actions.

All other provisions of this solicitation are unchanged.
