Client-Server to J2EE Migration

- Finalizing contract with Kumaran Systems
 - Service to migrate client-server applications to J2EE utilizing the eRA architecture
 - User Admin and Grants Management (including Person module) will be targeted first and used as proof of concept
 - Code maintainability and cost will be evaluated



CGAP & Grants.gov Status

- October/November CGAP Pilot Status
 - Received 20 new competing and continuing
 - Simple Research Grant Applications, modular budgets
 - Applicants sent in paper for back-up
 - Processed 13 successfully
 - Awaiting peer review in February
- CGAP Phase II Pilot (Upcoming)
 - Same criteria (excluding the need for paper)
 - Enhancements have been made for better processing
 - Few dozen expected
 - Plan to ramp up mid-2004 to a few hundred
- Grants.gov
 - Small pilot in February/March
 - System-to-system testing in March/April
 - Ramp up mid-2004

- eSNAP pilot open to all FDP organizations.


21,203 FSRs

Maintenance
