We fully support the comments submitted by People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA) on November 13, 2001. In particular, we agree with the comments of PETA and other animal protection organizations that not enough effort has been spent on developing the cytotoxicity tests as a replacement method for the *in vivo* acute toxicity tests.

We urge the NIEHS to develop a framework for the collection of data from the *in vitro* cytotoxicity assays used in starting dose calculations so that this information can immediately be used to validate the test series as a replacement method.
