## LIBRARY OF CONGRESS TRUST FUND BOARD ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 1999

#### **INTRODUCTION**

The Library of Congress Trust Fund Board, established in 1925, accepts gifts (other than gifts for immediate disbursement) and oversees the investment of those gifts (trust funds) for the benefit of the Library's collections and services. The Board establishes investment policy, and the Library of Congress implements procedures to carry out that policy. The Board's investment policy necessarily varies depending upon the terms of the individual trust funds and the restrictions on principal and earnings.

Annually, the Library of Congress reports on the financial position of the Trust Funds. This annual report for fiscal year 1999 is comprised of four sections:

- 2. Financial Statements Combined Financial Statements and accompanying notes
- 3. Supplemental Schedules Financial information relating to each trust fund

#### 1. OVERVIEW

#### The Library of Congress Trust Fund Board

The Library of Congress Trust Fund Board Act of March 3, 1925, as amended (2 U.S.C. 154-163), created the Library of Congress Trust Fund Board, a quasi-corporation with perpetual succession. The Board has the usual powers of trustees, including the authority to:

- "accept, receive, hold, and administer such gifts, bequests, or devises of property for the benefit of, or in connection with the Library, its collections, or its service, as may be approved by the Board and by the Joint Committee on the Library;"
- "invest, reinvest, or retain investments" after being receipted for by the Secretary of the Treasury;

- deposit trust funds "with the Treasurer of the United States as a permanent loan to the United States Treasury, and the Treasurer shall thereafter credit such deposit with interest at a rate which is the higher of the rate of 4 per cent per annum or a rate which is 0.25 percentage points less than a rate determined by the Secretary of the Treasury, taking into consideration the current average market yield on outstanding long-term marketable obligations of the United States;" and
- "adopt rules and regulations in regard to its procedure and the conduct of its business."

Public Law 102-246, approved February 18, 1992, expanded the size of the Trust Fund Board from five members to thirteen members. In addition to three ex-officio individuals, Board membership consists of two appointed by the President, four appointed by the House of Representatives, and four appointed by the Senate. As of September 30, 1999, all thirteen Board positions were filled.

On April 19, 1999, John Henry, of Florida was appointed member of the Library of Congress Trust Fund Board, for a term of 5 years (the preceding appointment had expired on December 21, 1998). On August 4, 1999, Mrs. Cecille Pulitzer, of Missouri was appointed member of the Library of Congress Trust Fund Board, for a term of 5 years (the preceding appointment had expired on March 24, 1998). On September 27, 1999, Edwin Cox, of Texas was appointed member of the Library of Congress Trust Fund Board, for a term of 5 years (the preceding appointment had expired on March 31, 1999).

At the Trust Fund Board meeting on April 14, 1999, the following resolutions were approved:

- 1. A resolution to ratify the poll votes for the following: (1) establish the Papamarkou Chair in Education Fund; and (2) establish the State Centers for the Book Trust Fund.
- 2. A resolution to accept the gift of \$100 from Dr. and Mrs. Ted H. Owen and additional contributions totaling over \$10,000 to establish the Blanton Owen Fund for Fieldwork at the Library of Congress to support awards to individuals and organizations for ethnographic field research and documentation and to encourage the addition of the results of such research and documentation to the collections of the Library of Congress.
- 3. A resolution to establish The Library of Congress 3<sup>rd</sup> Century Fund with all surcharges received by the Secretary of the U.S. Treasury from the sale of coins issued under the Library of Congress Bicentennial Commemorative Coin Act of 1998, Public Law No. 105--268 and paid by the Secretary to the Library of Congress Trust Fund Board [after the recovery of numismatic operation and program costs and the submission of an audited financial statement to the Secretary of the Treasury as required by 31 U.S.C. '5134(f)]. The fund s purpose is to support Library of Congress bicentennial programs, educational outreach activities (including schools and libraries), and other activities of the Library of Congress.
- 4. A resolution to accept an initial gift of \$5,280 from Steve Ristow and a pledge of an additional \$45,000 from Steve Ristow on behalf of his father, Walter Ristow (a former employee of the Library of Congress), to establish the *Walter Ristow Fund* at the Library of Congress to support the work of the Geography and Map Division, particularly for fellowships and other educational programs, and to assist in the acquisition of materials for the division's collections, particularly in the area of American cartography.

#### **Investment Policy**

At the Board's February 1997 meeting, a resolution was approved to implement and use a total return investment methodology as part of the Board's investment policy for growth and income investments and to adopt an investment policy which provides operational guidance to Trust Fund Board (TFB) members and Library of Congress Staff involved in the management and development of Library of Congress Trust Funds. The overall objectives of the Trust Fund Board's investment policy are to support trust fund activities by: (1) providing flexibility to have either a stable, growing stream of payouts (from income and capital appreciation) for current and future expenditures or, irregular payouts necessary for certain program requirements; (2) providing for the liquidity of investments to make payouts; and (3) maintaining the purchasing power of endowment trust funds. The Library encourages donors to include language in the gift instrument that authorizes the Trust Fund Board to invest the gifts in accordance with the Board's investment policy.

During fiscal year 1999, the Board s investment policy authorized the following three investment pools:

- 1. Special Issue Non-marketable Treasury Securities (Short-term Income Pool): In accordance with 2 U.S.C. 157, the TFB can invest in special issue non-marketable Treasury bills, notes, bonds, and overnight certificates of deposit. The interest rates for these securities are based upon the actual average market price for the identical marketable Treasury security.
- 2. Permanent Loan to the U.S. Treasury (Permanent Loan Treasury Pool): In accordance with 2 U.S.C. 158, the TFB can make a loan up to \$10 million to the U.S. Treasury and receive interest on loaned funds at the average rate of the outstanding long-term marketable obligations of the U.S. less 0.25 percentage points (minimum rate of 4 percent). Only the principal amount of a trust fund may be loaned to the U.S. Treasury.
- 3. Growth and Income Pool (G & I Pool): The TFB can invest in a private investment pool consisting of five mutual funds and one money market fund. The mutual funds recommended by the TFB s investment committee and approved by the TFB as of September 30, 1999 are:
- Vanguard Money Market
- Vanguard 500 Index
- Vanguard Total Stock Index
- Fidelity Fifty
- Fidelity Stock Selector
- Robertson Stephens Funds The Emerging Growth Fund

#### **Discussion and Analysis of Financial Information**

#### 1. Financial Reporting Standards

The Trust Funds Board's financial statements have been prepared to conform with the requirements of Statements of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) number 116 and 117. These statements provide for the accounting treatment for contributions and for the form and content of financial statements for not-for-profit organizations.

Permanently restricted net assets result from contributions and other inflows of assets whose use by the organization is limited by donor-imposed stipulations that neither expire by passage of time nor can be fulfilled or otherwise removed by actions of the organization. Temporarily restricted net assets result from donor-imposed restrictions that permit the Fund to use or expend the assets after the restriction has been satisfied.

Three exceptions to the standards cited above are as follows: (1) the activity associated with the particular type of net asset is not detailed in the Statement of Activities: (2) the Unrealized Loss on Investment is reported as a component of equity instead of being an element of income or loss; and (3) A Statement of Cash Flows is not presented.

#### 2. Statement of Financial Position

During fiscal year 1999, the Trust Fund Board's assets increased from \$65.9 million to \$67.8 million. The increase is attributed primarily to the increase in the market value of the private sector mutual funds during the fiscal year.

As of September 30, 1999, there were 92 separate Library of Congress Trust funds (including the G. M. Hubbard Fund) with a combined total net assets of \$66.6 million. (There were 16 additional funds maintained for reporting requirements because several Funds have multiple specific purposes.) The Trust Fund Board also received a 50 percent share (\$120,498) of the annual income of the Archer M. Huntington Fund (market value of \$6,874,129) held and managed by the Bank of New York as well as income from a trust established by Leonore (Mrs. Ira) Gershwin (\$771,089 in goods, services and direct contributions during fiscal year 1999).

#### 3. Statement of Activities

The Trust Fund Board's revenues totaled \$10.2 million for fiscal year 1999 including \$7.4 million in new gifts, donations, bequests and grants, \$0.1 million of miscellaneous revenue, and \$2.7 million in investment income.

After subtracting trust fund expenses of \$10.6 million, the operating change was a negative \$0.4 million for fiscal year 1999. An unrealized gain of \$2.4 million was recognized on stock mutual funds held during fiscal year 1999, which increased net assets (after offsetting the operating loss of \$0.4 million) by \$2 million. Total expenses increased 12.1 percent, as compared to fiscal year 1998. Five funds the James Madison National Council, the National Digital Library, the Gershwin, the Whittall, and the McKim accounted for \$9.1 million or 86 percent of all expenses.

Major contributions (including pledges) to the Trust Fund Board during fiscal year 1999 were:

During fiscal year 1999, the TFB accepted six new trust funds: (1) the Harper-Inglis Memorial Trust, (2) the Edwin L. Cox American Legacy Endowment, (3) the State Center for the Book Trust, (4) The Blanton Owen Endowment, (5) the Walter Ristow Endowment, and (6) the 3<sup>rd</sup> Century Trust. The Goldman Endowment was closed during fiscal year 1999.

### 4. Financial Information by Fund

Each trust fund is considered a separate entity and supplemental schedules in Section 3 present the financial position and results of operations for each fund, as well as budgetary fund balance data for restricted, obligated, and available funds.

The Statement of Financial Position by Fund, Schedule A, presents the net assets by Fund, where they are invested and the liabilities for each fund as of the end of the fiscal year 1998. Schedule B presents the restricted and unrestricted status and the amounts obligated and available at the end of fiscal year 1999. Schedule C is a detailed listing of the Funds invested in the permanent loan with the U. S. Treasury at September 30, 1999, and the increases and decreases in the balances during the fiscal year 1999.

The Statement of Activities by Fund, Schedule D, presents the fiscal year 1999 excess revenues over expenses and transfers in detail for each Fund. Schedule E presents the revenues by category for each Fund. Schedule F is the expenses for each Fund.

### LIBRARY OF CONGRESS TRUST FUND BOARD NOTES TO THE COMBINED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FISCAL YEAR ENDED SEPTEMBER 30, 1999

#### **Note 1. Reporting Entity**

In 1909, the Library of Congress received its first bequest. Because the Library was not empowered to accept gifts of money, the bequest was accepted by an Act of Congress (Public Law (37 Stat. 319-20) on August 20, 1912. This first bequest was from Mrs. Gertrude Hubbard to benefit the Gardiner Greene Hubbard Collection.

In 1924, the Librarian of Congress requested authority to accept future gifts and bequests of money. The following year, the Congress created the Library of Congress Trust Fund Board (2 U.S.C. 154-163 et seq.) as a quasi-corporation with perpetual succession and all the usual powers of a trustee, including the power to "invest, or retain investments" and, specifically, the authority "to accept, receive, hold, and administer such gifts, bequests, or devises of property for the benefit of, or in connection with, the library, its collections, or its services, as may be approved by the Board and by the Joint Committee on the Library."

#### Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The accompanying combined financial statements report the financial position of the Library of Congress Trust Fund Board (TFB) and the results of its operations for the fiscal years 1999 and 1998. The statements were prepared from the Library of Congress financial management system in accordance with the form and content for entity financial statements specified by the Library's Financial Management Regulations and Directives and the accounting policies summarized in this note. The combined financial statements include the assets, liabilities, fund balances, and financial operations of all funds governed by the TFB, each of which is considered a separate accounting entity.

#### A. Basis of Accounting

The TFB s financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Under the accrual method, revenues are recognized when earned and expenses are recognized when a liability is incurred, without regard to receipt or payment of cash.

The Fund s financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) number 116 and 117. These statements provide for the form and content of financial statements for not-for-profit organizations and recognize net assets based on the existence of applicable restrictions limiting their use.

Permanently restricted net assets result from contributions and other inflows of assets whose use by the organization is limited by donor-imposed stipulations that neither expire by passage of time nor can be fulfilled or otherwise removed by actions of the organization. Temporarily restricted net assets result from donor-imposed restrictions that permit the Fund to use or expend the assets after the restriction has been satisfied.

Three exceptions to the standards cited above are as follows: (1) the activity associated with the particular type of net asset is not detailed in the Statement of Activities; (2) the Unrealized Loss on Investment is reported as a component of equity instead of being an element of income or loss; and (3) a Statement of Cash Flows is not presented.

#### **B.** Capital Assets

The accompanying combined statement of financial position does not include capital assets. Capital assets with a value of \$25,000 or more (\$10,000 or more for years prior to fiscal year 1998) are available for the general use of the Library of Congress, and, accordingly, such acquisitions are recorded at cost when purchased as transfers to the Library of Congress general fund. Capital assets, including items for the collections (Heritage Assets) and items purchased to comply with the terms of a specific trust fund, with a value of less than \$25,000, are expenses of the Trust Funds.

#### C. Income Tax

The Library of Congress is an instrumentality of the United States and, as such, is not subject to income taxes.

#### Note 3. Cash

Cash consists of a fund balance with the Department of Treasury in the amount of \$532,687.

#### Note 4. <u>Investments (Net)</u>

The Library of Congress Trust Fund Board determines the investment policy for the trust funds. The policy provides three options for investment of trust funds:

! a permanent loan with the U. S. Treasury

- ! a pool of U.S. Treasury market-based securities
- ! a private investment pool consisting of five mutual funds and one money market fund. The mutual funds recommended by the Trust Fund Board's investment committee and approved by the TFB are:

Vanguard Money Market
Vanguard 500 Index
Vanguard Total Stock Index
Fidelity Fifty
Fidelity Stock Selector
Robertson Stephens Funds - The Emerging Growth Fund

Under 2 U.S.C. 158, up to \$10,000,000 of the Library's trust funds may be invested with the U.S. Treasury as a permanent loan at a floating rate of interest, adjusted monthly, but no less than four percent per annum. The permanent loan is an interest-bearing investment recorded at cost which is market value. At September 30, 1999, \$10,000,000 (including the G.M. Hubbard Fund) was invested in the permanent loan to the U.S. Treasury at an interest rate of 6 percent.

Treasury securities are intended to be held to maturity, are valued at cost, and are adjusted for the amortization of discounts and premiums. Interest is computed using the straight-line method which approximates the effective interest method.

Mutual and money market funds are stated at current market value and are considered available for sale. Unrealized gains and losses are recognized and recorded as a component of equity in the statement of financial position.

During 1999, an unrealized gain on mutual fund investments of \$2,380,837 resulted from the overall increase in the stock market at the end of the fiscal year.

In addition to the private mutual funds, the Archer M. Huntington Fund for the Hispanic Room and the Chair of Poetry of the English language is held and managed by the Bank of New York. The Bank and the Librarian are co-trustees for this account. Because the Bank of New York controls these funds, assets with a fair value of \$6,874,120 at September 30, 1999, are not recorded as assets of the Library of Congress Trust Fund. The trust fund's interest in this endowment is limited to 50 percent of the annual income. For fiscal year 1999, the Library received \$126,779 which was included in gifts received by the Library.

Similarly, under the will of Mrs. Leonore Gershwin, the Library is a 37.5 percent beneficiary of the income generated from a trust established by Mrs. Gershwin. The will established the "Library Charitable Trust" which was accepted by the Library of Congress Trust Fund Board in January 1992. The primary purpose of the Trust is to perpetuate the name and works of George and Ira Gershwin through all resources of the Library. The charitable trust does not belong to the Library but is a separate entity administered by trustees. In addition to investing Mrs. Gershwin's initial endowment, the trustees are responsible for augmenting it through licensing and other fees. The trustee remited \$61,500 of funds to the Library upon request of the Music Division to carry out the terms of the trust. The Library Charitable Trust (Trustee Administered) also provided \$709,589 of goods and services to the Library during fiscal year 1999. The balance or principal of the trust will be distributed to the Library in 2033, fifty years after the date of death of Ira Gershwin.

#### Note 5. Pledges Receivable

At September 30, 1999, the Library had unconditional pledges of contributions totaling \$11,936,007 which were discounted through fiscal year 2004 at a market discount rate and included in the statement of financial position at their discounted value of \$10,530,159. The amounts due in future years, at September 30, at their current discounted value are:

In fiscal year 1998, John W. Kluge, Chairman, James Madison Council pledged \$5,000,000,(in the form of a 2:1 matching gift for the first \$2,500,000 raised from other donors), to the National Digital Library Trust Fund. The full net present value of the pledge was included in the total pledges of the NDLTF as of September 30, 1998. A provision of the \$5,000,000 pledge stipulated that the Library could use his gift or a portion of the \$5,000,000 pledge for support of the Library's Bicentennial celebration when pledges from other donors to the NDLTF exceeded the required matching amount of \$2,500,000. The Library has received enough pledges to the NDLTF as of September 30, 1999, to enact the provision so that \$3,000,000 of the pledge could be transferred to the James Madison Council Trust Fund for the Bicentennial celebration. The present value of the \$3,000,000 portion of the pledge is \$2,691,300 which has been transferred to the James Madison Council Trust Fund as of September 30, 1999.

#### Note 8. Imputed Financing for Cost Subsidies

The Federal Accounting Standards Advisory Board (FASAB) issued Statement of Federal Financial Accounting Standards Number 5 (SSFAS-5) — Accounting for Liabilities of the Federal Government . SSFAS-5 requires those employing agencies recognize the full cost of pensions and other health and life insurance benefits during their employees active years of service. SSFAS-5 requires that the Office of Personnel Management, as administrator of the Civil Service and Federal Employees Retirement Systems, the Federal Employees Health Benefits Program, and the Federal Employees Group Life Insurance Program provide the cost factors that adjust the agency contribution rate to the full cost for the applicable benefit program. As a result of SSFAS-5, an adjustment of \$130,626 was recorded as an imputed financing source (reported as a Miscellaneous Revenue) and a corresponding expense in the accompanying financial statements. This adjustment did not change the net assets.

#### Note 9. Subsequent Events

The Library of Congress Trust Fund Board approved a resolution to accept a gift of \$250,000 from David Rockefeller during its meeting on November 17, 1999. The Joint Committee on the Library subsequently approved the new Henry Kissinger Trust Fund in February 2000. The purpose of the gift is to establish the Henry A. Kissinger Chair in Foreign Policy and International Relations Trust Fund at the Library of Congress.




# TRUST FUNDS: 10-YEAR HISTORICAL GROWTH U.S. TREASURY/PRIVATE INVESTMENTS



10-YEAR COMPARISONS - MILLIONS of DOLLARS






