Repatriation or Priority	of Custody/Ownership
If no lineal descendant identified Culturally Affiliated Indian Tribe	Indian Tribe on whose tribal land cultural items were found If no tribal land Culturally Affiliated Indian Tribe If no culturally affiliated tribe Indian Tribe aboriginally occupying the land, as determined by the Indian Claims
If no lineal descendant or culturally affiliated Indian Tribe is identified, the museum/agency retains culturally unidentifiable human remains.	Commission of U.S. Court of Claims Unless another tribe has a stronge cultural relationship Indian Tribe with stronger cultural relationship

Required Public Notice

Federal Register – Notice of Inventory Completion, Notice of Intent to Repatriate **Local newspaper(s)** – Notice of Intended Disposition

If custody cannot be determined or no claim is received, the agency retains unclaimed remains and objects.
