Fellow citizens & compatriots--| am besieged, by a thousand or more of the Mexicans under Santa Anna--| have sustained a continual Bombardment & cannonade for 24 hours & have not lost a man -- The enemy

has demanded a surrender at discretion, otherwise, the garrison are to be put to the sword, if the fort is taken -- | have answered the demand with a cannon shot, ξ_{\rightarrow} our flag still waves proudly from the walls -- | shall never surrender or retreat. Then, | call on you in the name of Liberty, of patriotism ξ_{\rightarrow} everything dear to the American character, to come to our aid, with all dispatch -- The enemy is receiving reinforcements daily ξ_{\rightarrow} will no doubt increase to three orfour thousand in four or five days. If this call is neglected, | am determined to sustain myself as long as possible ξ_{\rightarrow} die like a soldier who never forgets what is due to his own honor ξ_{\rightarrow} that of his country -- Victory or Death
