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THIS IS WHAT HAPPENED IN AREA V LAST WEEK.....

August 20, 1969

Representatives of the medical community serving the East Los Angeles area met Aug. 15 to hear a presentation of the objectives and plans for the Study of Health Needs being conducted by the community with the support of AREA V RMP and the Welfare Planning Council. "The opinions of providers of health care--as well as those of consumers -- are needed in the identification of needs and in the development and implementation of solutions satisfactory to both," stated FRANK AGUILERA (AREA V - COMMUNITY PROGRAMS) in urging the active involvement of the physicians as essential to the total success of the study. A valuable exchange of information took place and interest shown by the group is encouraging.

AREA V STAFF included WILLIAM A, MARKEY, Deputy Coordinator, TOMI MOORS, (Staff Assistant) and ART HERNANDEZ, of the East L. A. Health Project.

The proposal "Computerized ECG Analysis for Community Hospital Use" is to be withdrawn from the next CCRMP Review to allow time for the inclusion of certain features suggested by AREA V CARDIAC COMMITTEE after their study of the proposal on August 12. The additional time will also enable the staff to take advantage of the recommendations made by the Technical Panel which reviewed the proposal on Aug. 14. The Psnel were of the opinion that the general is were technically feasible and commended the idea as meeting a definite need in California.

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Paul C. Ward, Executive Director CCRMP, will be the key speaker at the Conference on Community Health Resources being pland by the Interdisciplinary Committee on Continuity of Patient Care. The conference is scheduled for Friday, Nov. 21, 1969 at Sportsman Lodge in North Hollywood. (Way back on July 2 ARZA V-MINUTE NEWS described this event as an "educational workshop focused on planning activities in the San Fernando Valley"-- remember?) Between 300-350 participants are expected to attend. DOROTHY E. ANDERSON, RN, MPH represented AREA V at the August 15 meeting of the planning committee.

At their meeting at Norris Library on Aug. 14, AREA V LIBRARY SERVICES COMMITTEE decided on some changes of format for their proposal, which will move the emphasis from equipment to people and organization. A telephone survey to collect information about facilities and resources of hospital libraries in each of the AREA V 'Medical Districts" is being planned. The group were given a demonstration of the Xerox Telecopier II and studied whether or not physicians could make use of such information as could be transmitted by this equipment. MR. WILLIAM L. MILLARD, of the Dept. of Research in Medical Education USC (and member of AREA V CONTINUING EDUCATION COMMITTEE) was invited to discuss those aspects of the library proposal which involve audiovisual equipment and materials, and slow-scan TV. Mrs. Lois Colaianni (Bio-Medical Librarian, Area IV RMP) was a guest. for a ligitor.

DRMP advise that the next site visit for the California Region will be scheduled October 13 and 14, with location to be advised later.
