

Arizona State University's Polytechnic campus is home to the East College, the Morrison School of Agribusiness & Resource Management and the College of Technology & Applied Sciences. Courses were first offered at the campus in Fall 1996. As a polytechnic-focused campus, the emphasis is on professional and technical programs that prepare graduates to move directly into careers and become ethical leaders in their professional, public and personal lives.

Students can earn ASU bachelor's, master's and Ph.D. degrees at the 600-acre campus in southeast Mesa, in an environment characterized by small class sizes, an integrated curriculum and accessible faculty. The degrees incorporate practical and theoretical exercises, weaving science and technology throughout the programs.




