SUBJECT: Renewable Resources Extension Act (RREA) Funds Distribution for FY 2005

The Renewable Resources Extension Act (RREA) allocation to States for fiscal year (FY) 2005 is attached. The Cooperative State Research, Education, and Extension Service (CSREES) FY 2005 appropriation for this program is \$4,060,256; this is an increase of \$20,234 or 0.5%. This small increase will be allocated to the National Focus Fund Project program for which the ECOP Forestry Task Force provides project recommendations.

In May 2004, the ECOP Forestry Task Force released the FY 2005 - FY 2009 RREA Strategic Plan (www.rreaprograms.net) which was jointly developed by the Federal and State partners. Working in concert with the Forestry Task Force, we will use the plan to invest in specific RREA program priorities for the next five years. Thus, I ask that you now focus your institution's RREA funds on one or more of the strategic issues that are identified in the plan:

- Diverse Audiences
- Economic Opportunities for Individuals and Communities
- Forest Stewardship and Health
- Invasive Species
- Land Conversion, Fragmentation, and Parcelization
- Public Policy
- Rangeland Stewardship and Health
- Wildlife and Fisheries Resources

You will note on the attached budget form that the program categories parallel the issues in the RREA Strategic Plan. Please align your RREA-supported programs with the strategic issues. I call your attention to the issue of serving diverse audiences and ask that you ensure your programs reached the diversity of under-served audiences that would benefit from your programs.

The criticality of ensuring that federal funds are spent as intended and that results are achieved necessitates that we increase the emphasis on program accountability. A key to program accountability is ensuring that RREA funds are spent in a manner that directly results in extension education programs. Additionally, over the next several months, the RREA Program Manager will be working closely with extension forest and rangeland program leaders and

evaluation specialists to identify processes that will provide more substantive and robust program impact reports that meet the needs of CSREES to demonstrate program effectiveness. As part of our commitment to implementing the RREA Strategic Plan, we have allocated some administrative funds to support a three-day workshop this year to determine how the Federal-State partnership can acquire the data called for by the performance indicators in the RREA Strategic Plan. Additionally, beginning in FY 2006, we anticipate that RREA program planning and reporting will be incorporated into the electronic system currently known as the Current Research Information System (CRIS). Together, we can and must do better in reporting the impacts of the federal funds that are provided through the Renewable Resources Extension Act.
