# Women in Agriculture


The 2002 Census of Agriculture provides a focused picture of women's participation in and contribution to agriculture. The census is a key step in identifying program development that will address the changing needs of farmers and ranchers.


The 2002 Census of Agriculture is the most comprehensive source of statistics portraying our Nation's agriculture. It is the only source of uniform agricultural data for every county in the United States.


For the first time, the census collected information for more than one operator per farm. Demographic and other information were collected for up to three operators per farm: the principal operator plus one or two additional operators. This may be fewer than the total number of operators on some farms. All operators refer to these multiple operators. Demographic data for up to the three operators reported are presented separately for women, by race categories, and for Spanish, Hispanic, or Latino origin.


