In an all-DoD memorandum of January 18, 2008, Mr. Shay Assad, Director of Defense Procurement and Acquisition Policy, encourages the use of non-DoD contracts and the services of assisting agencies to meet DoD requirements. - GSA has partnered with DoD and its service organizations since its creation in the 1940's. Working with GSA's procurement experts saves time needed by DoD to concentrate on mission critical procurements, such as those that may be associated with Operation Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom.

- GSA offers the Veterans Technology Service (VETS) GWAC, Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business (SDVOSB) contracts, which the Under Secretary of Defense strongly endorsed in a memo dated July 12, 2007. The VETS GWAC enables DoD to purchase integrated technology solutions from small businesses owned by service-disabled veterans. It is the result of Executive Order 13360.
