INTRODUCTION

One of the principle sources of information about the changing patterns of the health status of Alaska Natives is natality and mortality statistics. This report represents a summary of trends (1980 through 1997) in the health status of Alaska Natives as indicated by their birth and infant death rates.

Source data on births and infant deaths was obtained from special natality and mortality reports prepared by the Indian Health Service. The most recent data year available is 1997.

TERMINOLOGY

The terms death rate and mortality rate and birth rate and natality rate are used interchangeably. Below are several terms and definitions which are quoted in this publication.

Birth Rate/Natality Rate. The number of live births per 1000 total population (Table 3), or by 1000 women in the age group (Table 4). The birth rates for 15-17 year olds are nearly identical between the U.S. and Alaska Native populations. The 1997 U.S. rate is 63.7 births per 1000 women compared to the Alaska Native three-year average (1995-97) rate of 63.1. (Ventura SJ, Mosher WD, Curtin SC, Abma JC, Henshaw S. Fertility Rate. The number of live births per 1000 women of reproductive age, 15-44 years of age. The three-year average fertility rate of 118.4 for Alaska Natives is nearly double that of the 1997 U.S. rate of 65.0.

Infant Death/Infant Mortality Rate. The number of deaths under one year of age divided by the number of live births, expressed as deaths per 1000 live births.

Neonatal Mortality Rate. The number of deaths in the first four weeks of life divided by the number of live births, expressed as deaths per 1000 live births.

Post Neonatal Mortality Rate. The number of deaths to infants between the ages of four weeks and one year of life divided by the number of live births, expressed as deaths per 1000 live births.

METHODOLOGY

In small populations, the number of births (or infant deaths) are frequently too small to be useful over time. Therefore, averages are often calculated over a specific time frame. Three-year moving averages have been tabulated. For example, the three-year rate for 1997 refers to the average of the years 1995, 1996, and 1997. The "moving average" methodology reduces the effect of year-to-year variations in categories where small numbers of births (or infant deaths) occur.

IHS publications apply an adjustment formula when preparing mortality statistics in order to adjust for misclassification of race on state death certificates. This publication does not adjust for death certificate misclassification since the deaths reported here are infants under the age of one and since the state of Alaska has less of a problem miscoding race on death certificates (less than 5.3%) than other states.

NOTES

The population counts used in determining the birth rates in Table 3 are Indian Health Service estimates based upon the 1980 and 1990 U.S. Censuses with the addition of births and subtraction of deaths.

Population counts, estimated by the Alaska Department of Labor by cohort group, were the source to compute denominators for the Alaska fertility and birth rates in Table 4. The following *Population Overviews* published by the Alaska Department of Labor were used for this report: 1986 and Provisional 1987 Estimates, 1988 and Provisional 1989 Estimates and 1999 Estimates. Annual population estimates, by age, race and sex, from 1980 to 1997 came from these three publications with the exception of 1989.

For 1989, the only Alaska population figures published were by age and sex. To estimate the 1989 Alaska Native population in Table 4, the appropriate 1988 Alaska Native population percentages were applied to the 1989

Alaska female population by age group. For example, 18.1% of 1988 Alaska's 14-17 year old population were Alaska Natives. The 18.1% figure was applied to the 1989 Alaska female population of 15, 16, and 17 year olds.

In Chart 1, ten-year rates were used to compare infant mortality rates between service units since the number of deaths within a service unit is so small. Infant mortality trends within the service unit (Table 3) are displayed in three-year average rates.





Alaska Native Birth and Infant Death Rates







Neonatal Death Rates


