

The Cooperative Extension System's support ensures that a professional journal of high quality is published for Extension educators. These educators tell us they read the journal to "know what others are doing and to gain program ideas for future use." The journal both strengthens our knowledge base as Extension professionals and improves our effectiveness as educators. To underwrite the *Journal of Extension*, the Extension Committee on Policy (ECOP) has endorsed an FTE-based payment plan to equitably share the amount that each Extension organization pays as an institutional sustaining subscriber to continue publication of this electronic journal.

## 2005 Statistics

- Journal of Extension received 274 submissions, up from an all-time high of 279 in 2004.
- A total of 168 articles were published in the 6 issues released in 2005.
- The Web site averaged over 4.16 million pages viewed by readers in over 150 countries.
- An estimated 4,200 readers accessed the site daily in 2005 this compares to 2,900 readers daily in 2004.
