- Chemical Use Strategy that includes the use of Integrated Pest Management.
- Monitoring documentation that includes pollinator species inventories, the management of grazing and pollution problems, and educational and community outreach programs.
- Maps or aerial photos of the site. Information such as location of pollinator projects and other relevant features should be noted on the site maps or aerial photos.
- Photo documentation* of the site before and after the pollinator friendly practices were in place. Each photo should be dated and refer to locations identified on maps or photos of the site.
