New Zealand Meat and Wool Export Summary

LAMB: Another good rain late last week and over the weekend over most of the country looks likely to put farmers well on the way for a good start to Autumn. Store lamb buyers are starting to strongly compete for the reduced supply of stock and this is expected to continue. Overseas buyers of NZ lamb are acknowledging the shortages in product and are buying in steady quantities. Schedule and spot prices for this week are steady to up 5 c/kg on last week to \$4.90/kg in the North Island and\$5.10/kg in the South.
