

Just the Facts:



There are currently over 4.1 million records in AGRICOLA.

Seventy-eight percent of these (about 3,200,000) describe journal articles and book chapters, and the remaining twenty-two percent (900,000) describe monographs, serials, maps, computer files, and audiovisuals.

AGRICOLA has citations for titles in 114 languages; approximately 75 percent are in English.

Since 1970, AGRICOLA has been available online through various information retrieval brokerage services.

Presently, AGRICOLA is available online via the NAL Web site as well as through Dialog, OCLC's (Online Computer Library Center, Inc.) FirstSearch system, etc.


The AGRICOLA database covers materials in all formats, including printed works from the 15th century.

AGRICOLA records describe publications and resources encompassing all aspects of agriculture and allied disciplines, including animal and veterinary sciences, entomology, plant sciences, forestry, aquaculture and fisheries, farming and farming systems, agricultural economics, extension and education, food and human nutrition, and earth and environmental sciences.

Approximately 5,000 new indexing records are added to the Article Citation Database each month and 1,200 new cataloging records are added to the NAL Catalog each month.



The Food Guide Pyramid


