From Interstate 81 (Exit 143)

Take 581/220 South to Colonial Avenue Exit ~ 8 Miles
Take a left at the stoplight at the end of the exit ramp
At the 3rd light, the VWCC Campus is located on both
sides of Colonial Avenue

Park in the lower lots along Colonial Avenue (on the
left) and walk to Whitman Auditorium in the Business
Science Building on the right side of Colonial Avenue

From Route 220 North

Take Colonial Avenue/Wonju Exit off 220/581
Turn right at end of ramp and continue to stoplight
Turn left at light onto Colonial Avenue
Continue on Colonial Avenue through next light
VWCC is located on both sides of Colonial Avenue ~
