- Successful implementation essential to achieving the goals of the National Strategy and meeting 21st Century National Security challenges.

Reevaluate the HSPD-8 scenarios

 Conduct pilot evaluation(s) with IED Scenario, then reassess and allow local flexibility to build & focus on the most likely regional scenario(s).

Refine Lexicon

- Universal Task List is prescriptive and not indicative of its application – consider "Preparedness Tasks"
- Target Capabilities List (TCL) is a confusing term consider "Performance Guidance"
- "Tiers" as a concept is confusing replace with the more common term "Regional"



(Cont. 1)

Stress Regional Cooperation

Minimize gaps between UASI and state, and state-to-state guidelines

Focus on Performance

- Absent a performance based assessment methodology, the current TCL focuses excessively on equipment
- Performance based assessment methodology required.

Examine and Further Define the Role of the Private Sector

Essential to effective HSPD-8 implementation



(Cont. 2)

- The Roll-out of HSPD-8 is fundamental to successful implementation
 - Invest in a professional Roll-out strategist.
 - Engage an independent message creator
 - Advertising/media experience a must
 - Engage the operators (emergency response community and the private sector)
 - Create a simple, consistent, and repeatable message.
 - Tailor to geographic regions and their demographics
 - Delivery made by senior DHS and supporting Federal regional, state, local, and private sector officials



(Cont. 3)

- Ensure HSPD-8 related resources and authorities align with Departmental responsibilities
 - DHS is responsible for Emergency Medical Response and Hospital Readiness
 - Create Assistant Secretary for Medical Readiness/Response
 - Consolidate medical readiness resources
 - HHS continue to focus on public health preparedness



The Bottom Lines

- Successful implementation of HSPD-8 is a National priority
- National Homeland Security Policy development must be a disciplined and highly integrated activity
 - Avoid Federal Micromanagement
 - Policy complexity is a barrier to success.
 - Policy clarity is more difficult, but imperative for successful execution of all Homeland Security policies.
- ERSAC supports creation of an HSPD-8 implementation plan that provides maximum flexibility and encourages innovation at all levels (Regional, State, Tribal, Local, and Private Sector).
