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Program Title: **Public Housing Capital Fund**

Short Description: Capital and management activities for public housing agencies

ARRA Appropriation nationwide: \$3,000,000,000

Estimated New Hampshire Funds: \$7,725,542

Granting Agency: U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development

Managing Agency: N.H. Public Housing Authorities

Status: Direct from HUD

Award Criteria: Not yet announced.

Time Line for use: Public housing agencies obligate 100% of funds within 1 year of availability

- Public housing agencies expend 60% of funds within 2 years of availability
- Public housing agencies expend 100% of funds within 3 years of availability

Program Title: **Home Investment Partnership Program**

Short Description: Low income housing tax credits to state housing credit agencies

ARRA Appropriation nationwide: \$2,250,000,000

Estimated New Hampshire Funds: Not yet allocated

Granting Agency: U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development

Managing Agency: N.H. Public Housing Authorities

Status: Awaiting U.S HUD allocation

Award Criteria: Proportional to HOME funds apportioned to each state for fiscal year 2008

Time Line for use: State commits minimum 75% of funds by February 16, 2010

- Project owners expend 75% of funds available to State by February 16, 2011
- Project owners expend 100% of funds available to State by February 16, 2012

Program Title: **Rural Community Facilities**

Short Description: Loans and/or grants to assist communities with a population of less than 20,000 with essential community facilities.

ARRA Appropriation nationwide: \$130,000,000

Estimated New Hampshire Funds: Unknown – competitive application process

Granting Agency: US Department of Agriculture

Managing Agency: US Department of Agriculture

Status: **Municipalities may submit grants to USDA now.**

Award Criteria: Priority to projects for:

- Municipalities with population under 5000;
- Low Income Communities; and
- Healthcare, public safety, or public and community services.

Time Line for use: Preference to activities that can be started and completed expeditiously, including a goal of using at least 50 percent of the funds for activities that can be initiated not later than 120 days after the date of the enactment of this Act. Recipients shall also use grant funds in a manner that maximizes job creation and economic benefit. ARRA, Sec 1602.

Granting Agency: National Science Foundation

Applying Agency: New Hampshire Public or Private Colleges/Universities with
Research Facilities

Status: Awaiting announcement of grant terms, conditions, and criteria

Award Criteria: Not yet announced.

Time Line for use: Preference to activities that can be started and completed expeditiously, including a goal of using at least 50 percent of the funds for activities that can be initiated not later than 120 days after the date of the enactment of this Act. Recipients shall also use grant funds in a manner that maximizes job creation and economic benefit. ARRA, Sec 1602.

Granting Agency: United States Homeland Security

Applying Agency: Municipalities

Status: Awaiting Homeland Security /FEMA grant announcement

Award Criteria: Not yet announced

Time Line for use: Preference to activities that can be started and completed expeditiously, including a goal of using at least 50 percent of the funds for activities that can be initiated not later than 120 days after the date of the enactment of this Act. Recipients shall also use grant funds in a manner that maximizes job creation and economic benefit. ARRA, Sec 1602

Fire Stations

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, within the funds appropriated to the federal Department of Homeland Security, provides \$210,000,000 nationwide for modifying, upgrading, or constructing non-Federal fire stations. Five percent of the funds are available to Homeland security to administer the program and no one grant may exceed \$15,000,000. The Department of Homeland Security maintains a web site which explains their “Assistance to Firefighters” grant program. It is expected these fire station funds will be made available through that program. Municipalities interested in stimulus funds to modify, upgrade, or construct a fire station should consider applying for this program. The web site can be found at:
