Short Description:       Funds provided to the states to carry out activities to implement healthcare associated infections reduction strategies.

Specifically, \$1 billion was made available to the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) for a prevention and wellness fund:

- \$50 million for Healthcare-Associated Infections;
- \$650 million for community-based prevention and wellness programs; and
- CDC directly stands to receive \$300 million by expanding the Section 317 immunization program to help ensure more under-insured children and adults receive recommended vaccines.

- Grants federal matching funds to states to cover legal immigrants who have been in the U.S. less than five years.
- Bill allows states to offer a premium assistance subsidy for qualified employer-sponsored health plans.
- Bill provides enhanced FMAP of difference from Title XIX FMAP up to maximum of 65%. At the base Title XIX enhanced FMAP of 6.2%, the SCHIP enhanced FMAP is 8.8%
