Purpose of ARRA To invest in transportation, environmental protection, and other infrastructure that will provide long-term economic benefits.








•To stabilize state and local government budgets, to minimize and avoid reductions in essential services and counterproductive state and local tax increases.















New Hampshire Expects Benefits From ARRA of \$500,000,000 to \$750,000,000







- Formula Allocations
- Competitive Grants
- Enhanced Entitlements



- Funds are allocated to the State of New Hampshire
- For Programs Available to Non-Profits and Business
- For Allocation to Municipalities
- For Allocation to Schools
- For State Programs







Funds Appropriated to Federal Agencies Awarded **Competitively** to New Hampshire Institutions

- National Institute of Health
 - 10.4 Billion Nationwide for Research (NH Colleges and Universities)



Department of Defense

Approximately 5 Million is allocated to the New Hampshire Adjutant General's Department (National Guard) for building restoration and modernization





Department of Defense

 Approximately 2.5 Million in additional funds are allocated to do work at the New Boston Air Force Station









Funds Appropriated to Federal Agencies Awarded **Competitively** to Municipalities

Federal Department of Agriculture

 Rural Communities – assist with buildings and Water/Water treatment infrastructure



Federal Department of Justice

- Community Oriented Policing Services
- Competitive funds to retain or hire new police officers
- April 14 Deadline



Benefits Direct to People in New Hampshire

- \$800 Making Work Pay tax credit for many working households
- Taxes are cut for the families of many children by expansion of the Child Tax Credit





 \$25 increased unemployment compensation per pay period

• Eligible former employees, enrolled in their employer's health plan at the time they were involuntarily terminated are required to pay only 35 percent of the cost of COBRA coverage for first nine months



ARRA Increases college affordability for students by funding the shortfall in Pell Grants

- Increases the maximum award level by \$500
- New higher education tax cut to nearly four million students nationwide



State:

 Every ARRA Dollar will be tracked with revenue and expenditure accounts that are unique to ARRA





- State:
 - State Departments will submit quarterly reports to federal authorities



There will be enhanced oversight:

- 184 Million to federal Inspector General's Offices for programs funded in N.H.
- Office of Economic Stimulus will utilize compliance personnel to assist State agencies, Municipalities, Schools, and Non-Profits







- Municipal/School Level:
 - Grant and allocation agreements will require separate tracking and reporting of ARRA funds







Accountable **Davis-Bacon Prevailing** Wage documentation will be required where applicable







Buy America compliance documentation will be required where applicable







- Businesses/Non-Profits:
 - Contracts/grants will contain additional data collection and reporting requirements
 - Jobs Created
 - Jobs Retained
 - Hours Worked/Wages Paid



- Businesses/Non-Profits:
 - Increased access to business records, employees, and officials of the contractor and sub-contractors by Federal and State auditors and Inspectors General

Transparent

 Municipalities, Schools, and Non-Profits using ARRA funds will be expected to post business opportunities on the NH Recovery
 Web Site







Transparent

 The site will have a new element that will identify those business opportunities that are ARRA funded







Avoid a Funding Cliff when ARRA appropriations are depleted







Prudent Use ARRA funds for infrastructure, goods, or services that bring lasting value to New Hampshire







Prudent

Use ARRA funds for new personnel or new programs only if they can be:

- Discontinued when the ARRA funds are depleted; or
- Funded from a non-tax source after ARRA funds are exhausted
