HOUSING

ASSISTED HOUSING STABILITY PROGRAM - Project Based Rental Assistance

Description: Provides funding for payments to owners of properties receiving project-based assistance under s. 202 of the Housing Act of 1959, s. 811 of the Cranston-Gonzalez national Affordable Housing Act, or s. 8 of the United States Housing Act of 1937 for project-based rental assistance as defined in P.L 110-161.

Funding Mechanism: HUD makes direct payments to owners over a 12-month period.

Eligible Entities: Businesses Individuals Responsibility for Implementation: Federal

ASSISTED HOUSING STABILITY PROGRAM - Energy Efficiency and Green Retrofits

Description: Provides funding for grants and loans to assist owners of properties receiving projectbased assistance under s. 202 of the Housing Act of 1959, s. 811 of the Cranston-Gonzalez national Affordable Housing Act, or s. 8 of the United States Housing Act of 1937 for energy efficiency retrofits and green investments.

Funding Mechanism: HUD administers through competitive grants or loans to eligible property owners.

LEAD HAZARD REDUCTION GRANTS - Department of Commerce

Description: Provides funding for competitive grants to local governments and nonprofit organizations to remove lead-based paint hazards in low-income housing.

Funding Mechanism: funding provided as the result of a competitive grant which was applied for in FY2008, but was not funded due to a lack of funding at that time. Commerce would distribute to local remediation contractors or property owners.

NATIVE AMERICAN HOUSING BLOCK GRANT

Description: This funding will rehabilitate and improve energy efficiency in housing units maintained by Native American housing programs.

Funding Mechanism: Half of the funding will be distributed by formula and half will be competitively awarded to projects that can be started quickly.

Description: Provides funding to help communities purchase and rehabilitate foreclosed, vacant properties in order to create more affordable housing and reduce neighborhood blight.

Funding Mechanism: Competitive grants to states, local governments, non-profits or consortia. Detailed program information not yet available

PUBLIC HOUSING CAPITAL FUND - Public Housing Capital Fund - Competitive

Description: Provides funding for public housing priority investment projects.

Funding Mechanism: Competitive grants. Detailed information not yet available.

RECOVERY ZONE BONDS - Economic Development Bonds

Description: Provides taxable Governmental Bonds that municipalities can use to spur development in areas with significant poverty, unemployment or home foreclosures. Bonds will be used for capital expenditures, public infrastructure, public facilities, job training and educational programs.

Funding Mechanism: \$10 billion total. Each state's share based on job loss formula. Allocation then sub-allocated to local municipalities based on job loss formula. Bonds must be issued in 2009 or 2010. Allocation amounts not yet available.

USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT - Rural Housing Service

Description: Provides funding for section 502 direct housing loans and loan guarantees including refinancing. Section 502 loans are for single family homes. Loans can be used for the purchase of existing homes, new construction, repair, or improvements.

Funding Mechanism: USDA Rural Development allocates funds to states based on historical use of the program.

YOUTHBUILD

Description: Provides funding for Youthbuild activities. In YouthBuild programs, low-income young people ages 16-24 work toward their GED or high school diploma while learning job skills by building affordable housing for homeless and low-income people. Strong emphasis is placed on leadership development and community service.

Funding Mechanism: Provides competitive grants to local Youthbulid programs throughout the state.
