<u>Program Title:</u> **Surface Transportation Infrastructure**

Short Description: Surface transportation projects, predominantly highways and

bridges

ARRA Appropriation nationwide: \$1,500,000,000

Estimated New Hampshire Funds: See Below

Granting Agency: U.S. Department of Transportation

Managing Agency: New Hampshire Department of Transportation

Status: As of February 25th, 2009, NHDOT has advertised \$40 million of Highway and Bridge Stimulus projects

<u>Award Criteria</u>: State Highway & Bridge Projects are being selected based on Ten Year Transportation Plan priority and the ability for these projects to be "Shovel Ready."

- Local funding, \$11 million, to be made available to communities through DOT State Aid Bridge and State aid Highway programs
- Local funding, \$3.8 million, to be made available to communities through DOT Transportation Enhancement program

Time Line for use:

- 50% of Highway & Bridge funds must be under contract before June 17, 2009 (120 days).
- All funds must be placed under contract by February 17, 2010 (1 year).
- Projects must be completed by February 17, 2012 (3 years).
- Funds not placed by deadlines will be redistributed to other states after 120 days and after 1 year.

<u>Program Title</u>: Capital Assistance for High Speed Passenger Rail Corridors and Intercity Passenger Rail Service

Short Description: Discretionary grants for high speed and intercity passenger rail

ARRA Appropriation nationwide: \$8,000,000,000

<u>Estimated New Hampshire Funds</u>: Unknown – competitive application process

Granting Agency: U.S. Department of Transportation, FRA

Managing Agency: N.H. Department of Transportation

Status: Awaiting information from U.S. Department of Transportation

<u>Award Criteria</u>: Priority to projects that support the development of intercity high speed rail service

Time Line for use:

• U.S. DOT submits strategic plan to Congress by April 17, 2009.

• U.S. DOT issues interim guidelines to grant seekers by June 16, 2009.

• U.S. DOT funds remain available until September 30, 2012.

Short Description: Transit capital assistance grants

ARRA Appropriation nationwide: \$6,900,000,000

Estimated New Hampshire Funds: \$13,490,304

Managing Agency: New Hampshire Department of Transportation

Status: Awaiting finalization of allocation and distribution

Award Criteria: Project priority within existing U.S. DOT programs

Time Line for use: Funds apportioned by March 9, 2009

- 50% of funds must be obligated by August 17, 2009
- 100% of funds must be obligated by February 16, 2010.
- Projects must be completed by February 17, 2012 (3 years).
- Funds not obligated by deadlines will be redistributed to other states after 120 days and after 1 year.

2009.

• 100% of fund must be placed under contract by Feb. 16,

2010

• Projects must be completed by Feb. 17, 2013

• Funds not placed by deadlines will be redistributed to other

states after 120 days and after 1 year.

<u>Award Criteria</u>: Priority within existing DOT programs

Time Line for use:

• Funds apportioned by March 9, 2009

• 50% of funds must be placed under contract by June 17, 2009.

• 100% of funds must be placed under contract by February 16, 2010

• Projects must be completed by February 17, 2011 (2 years)

• Sept. 30, 2010, recovered funds must be re-obligated by this date, or they will be lost.
