



137,301 households received FEMA-provided temporary housing units in the Gulf Coast.










## **Current Households Gulf-Wide Receiving Temporary Housing**

5,442 households currently occupy FEMA-provided temporary housing units in the Gulf Coast.








## **Relocation Status**

On a daily basis, FEMA case managers actively call and visit households to encourage them to relocate to hotel/motel, and/or alternate housing. The chart below tracks progress over the last four weeks with the previous two months also displayed for comparative purposes.



Households have several options when relocating from Temporary Housing Units including: move immediately into a Hotel/Motel for health concerns, be processed for rental assistance through HUD's Disaster Housing Assistance Program, or receive a Mississippi Cottage through the Alternative Housing Pilot Program. The chart below represents the relocation decisions each household has made to date.
