<p>Direction and Control</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">★ Describes the method used to facilitate round-the-clock policy making, coordination, and control of the organizations involved in response operations.★ Describes the policies, roles, and responsibilities of the organizations that perform core <i>life-saving ...</i> <p>...and <i>recovery</i> functions.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">★ Describes relationships of responding State personnel with Federal response force personnel.	<p>ESF-5 Information and Planning</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">★ During early part of the response, personnel may be located in the State EOC.★ ERT-N, ERT-A, FAsT, EST. <p>ESF-4 Firefighting</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">★ Provides personnel, equipment, and supplies to support States involved in rural, wild land, and urban firefighting operations.★ Provides fire-weather forecasting.★ Provides urban and industrial fire hazard analysis.★ Provides limited radio communications for use of responding firefighting groups when no common radio frequency is available. <p>ESF-9 Urban Search and Rescue</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">★ Coordinates with State officials on the requirements for Urban Search and Rescue support. <p>ESF-10 Hazardous Materials</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">★ Supports State/local response to a HAZMAT incident. <p>ESF-3 Public Works and Engineering</p> <p>Upon request by the State, provides for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">★ Emergency removal of debris.★ Temporary construction of emergency access routes.★ Emergency restoration of critical public services and facilities.★ Emergency demolition or stabilization of damaged structures designated as immediate hazards to the public health and safety, or as necessary to facilitate lifesaving operations.★ Technical assistance for damage assessment. <p>ESF-12 Energy</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">★ Coordinates with State officials to establish priorities to repair damaged energy systems.★ Coordinates providing temporary, alternate, or interim sources of emergency fuel and power.★ Assists State Coordinating Officer in establishing priorities to repair damage to energy systems. <p>Regional Response Plans (RRPs) address State/Federal interface issues.</p>
