Transportation Infrastructure Funds

Highway and Bridge Construction	\$27.5 billion	Formula with suballocation
Competitive Surface Transportation Grants	\$1.5 billion	Competitively awarded
Transit	\$8.4 billion	Discretionary

ARIZONA	FUNDING AMOUNT	Notes
Highway Infrastructure Investment	\$521,958,000	Does not include Competitive Grants
Transit Formula Funding	\$100,561,948	Excludes Fixed Guideway Modernization
Transportation Enhancements	\$15,659,000

Funds are to be made available no later than 21 days after the date of enactment.

Use It or Lose It

	Short Term	Mid Term - Long Term
State	120 days to obligate at least 50%. July 8, 2009	One year to obligate the balance. February 17, 2010
MPOs	No short term obligation provision.	100% of funds to be obligated within one year of enactment. February 17, 2010
Transit	180 days to obligate 50%. September 6, 2009	100% of funds to be obligated within one year of enactment. February 17, 2010

Unobligated balances will be withdrawn and subject to redistribution to States that have had no funds withdrawn.

	Economic Recovery Funds can be used on projects that meet current Federal Programs

- Road projects on Functionally Classified Roadways
- Transit Projects



Regional Council approved the attached list of projects listed in priority order. . . contingent upon projects finally selected receiving the necessary administrative adjustments and amendments to the MAG Transportation Improvement Program and air quality conformity and consultation.





Transit

MAG REGION	FUNDING AMOUNT
TOTAL Transit	\$65 - \$75 Million

- 80 Transit Projects \$1.8 Billion
- Possible additional funds in New Starts
- RPTA Board has recommended project criteria including, Project is part of Prop. 400, Project is not for procurement, and others
- Projects are not decided, the Board meets again in March

Scenarios based on:

- 1. Member Agency Allocation for Projects ready to go: AA, AB, BB
- 2. Priority to Proposition 400 Projects Highway
- 3. Priority to Prop. 400 Projects Highway & Street
- 4. Priority to Prop. 400 Projects Highway, Street, & Transit
- 5. Priority to TIP Status 'A' & NEPA Status 'A' Projects (AA)



MAG REGION	FUNDING AMOUNT
Highway - MAG Sub-Allocation	\$88.72 Million

- Scenario #1 Member Agency Allocation
 - #1A Minimum Agency Allocation PLUS Population
 - #1B Minimum Agency Allocation & Population

Prior to approving a TIP Amendment – Specific Projects need to be identified

- 'A & B' projects are good candidates
- 'C' projects are not good candidates



MAG REGION	FUNDING AMOUNT
Highway - MAG Sub-Allocation	\$88.72 Million

- Scenario #2 Priority to Proposition 400 Projects Highway
- Minimum of \$160.5 Million of projects

This list is subject to change depending on final funding amounts set by the Arizona Transportation State Board & the prioritized project list. The Projects to receive funding would have to be decided.



MAG REGION	FUNDING AMOUNT
Highway - MAG Sub-Allocation	\$88.72 Million

- Scenario #3 Priority to Prop. 400 Projects Highway & Street
 - \$47.4 Million of Street Projects in the ALCP 'AA'
 - Minimum of \$160.5 Million of Highway projects

It would have to be decided which projects receive funding.



MAG REGION	FUNDING AMOUNT
Highway - MAG Sub-Allocation	\$88.72 Million

- Scenario #4 Priority to Prop. 400 Projects Highway, Street,
 & Transit
 - \$47.4 Million of Street Projects in the ALCP 'AA'
 - Minimum of \$160.5 Million of Highway projects
 - \$457 Million Transit Projects in the TLCP. Transit projects have not been selected to use the Transit ARRA funds.

Prop. 400 Percent Allocation: Arterial - \$9.3 million (10.5%), Transit - \$29.5 million (33.3%), and Freeway - \$49.8 million (56.2%)



MAG REGION	FUNDING AMOUNT
Highway - MAG Sub-Allocation	\$88.72 Million

- Scenario #5 Priority to TIP Status 'A' & NEPA Status 'A' Projects (AA)
 - \$84 Million, with TEA projects \$89.2



Next Steps

- Continue working with Valley Metro and ADOT
- MAG Management and TPC in March
- Targeting March 25th Regional Council for:
 - Possible TIP amendment MAG Sub-Allocation
 - Conformity Consultation
- May need to call special Committee meetings in March if necessary
