Setting Myself Apart: Attending an RPCV Career Event

Following my COS in September of last year, I found myself looking for work in one of the toughest job markets in recent history. However, I had already begun to think about my long-term career goals even before I joined Peace Corps. I had a master's degree, a year of internship experience in Washington, DC, and I thought that with over two years of field experience in South America and Spanish language skills, I would quickly find a job with an international development organization in the Washington, DC, area, which is what I wanted to do. I was swiftly disabused of this notion by a contact in Washington, DC, who told me that every Returned Peace Corps Volunteer from Latin America wants to move to the DC area, find a job with an international development organization, and use their Spanish language skills, insinuating that I might change my mind and settle for something else. Despite this discouraging advice, I was quite convinced that I

was the real deal! I wasn't going to give up and I realized that I needed to somehow distinguish myself in the job market.

I had the opportunity to attend the RPCV Career Event in February, hosted by Peace Corps' Returned Volunteer Services. At the time, I was conducting my job search from my parents' home in South Carolina. I was spending hours each day searching for job postings on the Internet, writing cover letters, and tailoring my resume for specific opportunities. I was also talking to my professional contacts about job openings in my field. I felt like I was doing all the right things and I couldn't understand why the organizations where I was applying for positions weren't falling all over themselves to hire me! I learned of the Career Event through the RPCV listserv¹ and a fellow RPCV encouraged me to attend. I felt that it was an opportunity that I couldn't pass up. I called a friend living in Washington, DC, and

asked her to roll out her futon mattress, because I was coming for a visit.

From the first session on "storytelling" to the Thursday evening job fair, the workshop gave me the skills and knowledge I needed to set myself apart in the job market. I learned how to "advertise" my abilities, experience, and personal qualities in a way that was appealing to potential employers. At the storytelling session I began learning how to talk about my Peace Corps experience without getting that glazed-over look from my listener with which I had become a bit too familiar. Also, the initial practice talking about myself to complete strangers was useful without being intimidating, because these people were all RPCVs like me, looking for jobs, just like me. Over the course of the four-day conference I traded many stories with other RPCVs and drew inspiration from their experiences in-country and on the job hunt.

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The resume and cover letter writing sessions were filled with helpful tips that would get my application noticed and passed on to the next round instead of ending up in the "circular file." I learned how to format my resume and describe my qualifications in such a way that a human resource manager would be able to accurately evaluate my suitability for a job opening in the few seconds it takes to review a job application.

I had never felt very comfortable with using networking as a job search tool, but the networking workshop at the event gave me a useful formula for introducing myself to new contacts concisely and effectively while establishing mutually beneficial professional relationships. I learned the "right" and "wrong" ways to network, and I felt confident that I would be able to use this strategy effectively in the future.

The sessions on interviewing were particularly useful to me, because I learned questions that I was likely to be asked in real interviews, and I began to formulate my responses to these questions while participating in mock interviews. Listening to and evaluating the way other RPCVs responded to questions was also very helpful. I learned how to dress and use good body language so there was no doubt in my mind how to conduct myself in an interview. Finally, the job fair on Thursday night gave me the chance to practice everything I had learned over the course of the workshop.

At a job interview a few weeks later, I felt well-prepared and confident. It was a job that I really wanted, and I felt that the Career Event had given me the skills to excel in the interview. I'm happy to say that I got the job! Now I am working with an international development

organization in Washington, DC, just as I wanted to do. I can't thank Returned Volunteer Services enough for their support to Returned Peace Corps Volunteers, and I would encourage any RPCV looking for a job to take advantage of the Career Event.

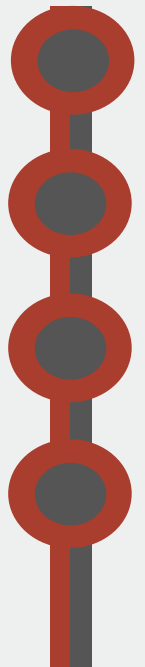
