PACIFIC COAST GROUNDFISH FISHERY

Changes to commercial and recreational management measures

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) announces changes to commercial management measures for the Pacific Coast groundfish fishery off Washington, Oregon, and California, **effective at 0001 hours (local time) May 1, 2008**.

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (Pacific Council) recommended changes to management measures at their March 10-14, 2008, meeting in Sacramento, CA. Changes to management measures are being implemented in a Federal Register notice that published on April 18, 2008 (73 FR 21057), and are described in this public notice.

Commercial Fishery

For complete regulations governing the commercial groundfish fishery, please see Title 50 CFR Part 660, Subpart G. Current trip limit tables, Tables 3-5 (North and South), are included at the end of this public notice.

Limited Entry Non-Whiting Trawl Fishery

For more detailed regulations applying to the limited entry trawl fishery, see § 660.381 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations.

Based on 2006 West Coast Groundfish Observer Program data, indicating different canary rockfish bycatch rates using selective flatfish trawl gear north of 40°10' N. lat., NMFS believes that the canary rockfish OY could be exceeded in 2008. Therefore, NMFS has implemented the following Pacific Council recommendations for May changes to the trawl RCA boundaries and trip limits:

Limited Entry Trawl Rockfish Conservation Area

NMFS will be modifying the seaward and shoreward boundaries of the trawl RCA to keep canary rockfish within their 2008 OY, and to allow some target opportunities in areas where canary bycatch rates are relatively low.

- From Leadbetter Point (46°38.17' N. lat.) to the Oregon-Washington Border (46°16' N. lat.), the seaward boundary of the trawl RCA is shifted seaward to a line approximating the 200 fm depth contour from May 1 through June 30;
- Between Oregon-Washington Border (46°16' N. lat.) and Cape Falcon (45°46' N. lat.), the seaward boundary of the trawl RCA is shifted shoreward to a line approximating the 150 fm depth contour from May 1 through August 31;
- Between the Cape Alava (48°10' N. lat.) and the Oregon-Washington Border, and between

Humbug Mountain (42°40.50' N. lat.) and 40°10' N. lat., the shoreward boundary of the trawl RCA is shifted shoreward to a line approximating the 60 fm depth contour beginning May 1 through October 31;

• For all other areas and times not included above, the trawl RCA has not changed from January 1, 2008, see Table 3 (North).

Limited Entry Trawl Trip Limits

NMFS will be decreasing cumulative limits for some species using selective flatfish trawl gear to keep canary rockfish within its 2008 OY.

- North of 40°10 N. lat., decrease Dover sole trip limits using selective flatfish trawl gear to 40,000 lbs per 2 months from May through August;
- North of 40°10 N. lat., decrease other flatfish trip limits using selective flatfish trawl gear to 50,000 lbs per 2 months from May through December;
- North of 40°10 N. lat., decrease Petrale sole trip limits using selective flatfish trawl gear to 18,000 lb per 2 months from May through October.

NMFS will be increasing cumulative limits for some species using large and small footrope gears to provide incentives to fish in areas of low canary rockfish abundance.

- North and South of 40°10 N. lat., increase sablefish trip limits using large and small footrope gear to 19,000 lb per 2 months from May through October;
- North and South of 40°10 N. lat., increase shortspine thornyheads trip limits using large and small footrope gear to 25,000 lb per 2 months from May through December;
- Between 40°10 N. lat. and 38° N. lat., increase minor slope and darkblotched rockfish trip limits to 15,000 lb per 2 months from July through October.

Limited Entry Non-Tribal Whiting Trawl Fishery

Catch of widow rockfish in the non-tribal limited entry trawl whiting fishery, combined with impacts from all other fisheries, is projected to exceed the 2008 widow rockfish OY. The Pacific Council considered raising the darkblotched rockfish bycatch limit to: increase flexibility in behavior of the non-tribal whiting fleet, so that they can move to offshore areas if they encounter widow rockfish early in the season; keep the impacts of all fisheries within the 2008 widow rockfish OY; and because darkblotched total catch is not projected to attain the OY. Therefore, NMFS has implemented the following Pacific Council recommendations for an increase in the darkblotched rockfish bycatch limit to 40 mt for the non-tribal limited entry trawl whiting fishery.

Open Access Sablefish Daily Trip Limit (DTL) Fishery

The salmon fishery in 2008 will be severely constrained off the coasts of Oregon and California. In anticipation of a large influx of fishing effort into the sablefish DTL fishery as a result of salmon fishery restrictions and closures, NMFS believes the 2008 sablefish OY could be exceeded. Therefore, NMFS has implemented the following Pacific Council recommendations for May changes to the sablefish DTL trip limits:

• North of 36° N. lat., decrease sablefish trip limits to 300 lb per day, or one landing per week of up to 800 lb, not to exceed 2,200 lb per two months from May through December.

Recreational Fishery off California

Recreational fishery catch projections indicate that the California state harvest limits for yelloweye, and canary rockfish would be exceeded without action to restrict California recreational fisheries. Therefore, the recreational rockfish conservation area closure is expanded toward the shore from 30 fm to 20 fm in the North (between the Oregon-California border and 40°10 N. lat.) and North-Central (between 40°10 N. lat. and 37°11 N. lat.) Management Areas. This action is in effect through the end of 2008; California has taken similar action to restrict state water fisheries for these fishing areas.

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Trip limit tables, effective May 1, 2008, are included at the end of this public notice.
