

## LACEY ACT AMENDMENTS OF 1981

VIOLATION	VIOLATION HISTORY - PENALTY AMOUNT
	All Violations
<b>A. 16 U.S.C. §3372(b)</b>	
Import, export, or transport in interstate commerce any container of fish (including shellfish) which has not been marked in accordance with applicable regulations and/or laws.	\$250 (Summary Settlement = \$175)
<b>B. 16 U.S.C. §3372(a) as it relates to vessels in Mexican waters of the Gulf of Mexico</b>	
(2) to import, export, transport, sell, receive, acquire, or purchase in interstate or foreign commerce – (A) any fish or wildlife taken, possessed, transported, or sold in violation of any law or regulation of any State or in violation of any foreign law	\$10,000* (Summary Settlement = \$2,000)
(3) within the special maritime and territorial jurisdiction of the United States – (B) to possess any fish or wildlife taken, possessed, transported, or sold in violation of any foreign or Indian tribal law	\$10,000* (Summary Settlement = \$2,000)
(4) to attempt to commit any act described in paragraphs (2) and (3) of §3372(a)	\$10,000* (Summary Settlement = \$2,000)
<b>C. Southeast Region Lacey Act – Recreational</b>	
Take, possess, etc.	\$100 - \$5,000

\* Seizure of entire catch may apply even on first violation.
