

PNSS Data Worksheet

The following PNSS table worksheet can be used to help you identify your health problems. The worksheet provides related *Healthy People 2010* objectives, reference population expected rates, and prevalence from U.S. surveys and surveillance for comparison with the national and state PNSS tables. Additionally, the worksheet lists the PNSS tables that are used to answer the questions of what, when, where, and who.
