Peace Corps Week: Become an RPCV Rock Star in Your Community

“Amber, Amber!” the third graders squealed as I entered the room. It wasn’t quite a rock star’s entrance, but it must have been close. That was the day I met my World Wise Schools class at Eton Elementary, in Eton, Georgia. The class had written to me faithfully for the two years that I was a Peace Corps Volunteer in Honduras.

Every time that the class wrote—about once every six to eight weeks—I got individual letters from each of the 20-plus students. Their letters made me laugh and cry ... and laugh until I cried. The students were curious and ingenious, as third graders tend to be. “Are lizards popular?” “Do you have a bathroom?” they wanted to know. And I must have answered the question “What do they eat there?” a hundred times. (Corn tortillas and black beans.) I remember one boy telling me, “I’ve been to another country. I’ve been to Maryland.”

I took great joy in responding to those letters, often passing them around for other PCVs to read. (We were all starved for letters from home.) In my second year, the class sent me

Stanley, a character from author Jeff Brown’s *Flat Stanley*. In the book, Stanley is knocked flat by a bulletin board, and his parents are able to send him places through the mail. My World Wise Schools Stanley was, in fact, a cutout created by the class and mailed to me, along with a disposable camera and instructions to take pictures of Stanley traveling through Honduras. I took photos of him feeding macaws at ancient Maya ruins, having dinner with the U.S. ambassador to Honduras, and weighing babies in a small community outside my town. I sent Stanley, along with the camera, back to the class a few months before I completed my service.

So it was with much excitement that the students greeted me, and I, them, that chilly February day. Since no introduction was necessary, I got right into a lesson I had prepared with a short overview of Honduras. “It’s the size of Tennessee,” I told them, knowing that since the Tennessee line is just a few miles from Eton, everyone should be able to relate.

Quickly, we moved on to other topics—most of them stories

from my life as a Volunteer. “Kid’s Day is a holiday like Mother’s or Father’s Day, but it’s for kids. School is canceled, bands play, and people dance in the street.” “That’s what we need!” one student interrupted. Another story was about finding a snake in my kitchen. “Aaaaahhh!” the class squealed in delight. (Why is it that kids seem to always take such joy in being afraid of snakes?!)

When I was finished with the stories, I showed a slide show of my service. The picture that everyone liked best was of my outdoor bathroom. “Ewww!” they exclaimed in unison when I explained what the small structure was. Afterward, we danced to the music of Kazzabe (my favorite Honduran band) and practiced our Spanish. (“How do you say, ‘My brother is a monkey?’” one girl asked.) For the final activity, we played Honduran tidbit trivia, and I handed out seashells to everyone, several of whom had never seen the ocean before.

It was exciting to be the subject of a living geography lesson. And the correspondence
