Peace Corps Week: 47th Anniversary Celebration

On March 1, 1961, President John F. Kennedy signed the executive order establishing the Peace Corps. Each year, during the week of this anniversary date, the Peace Corps community unites to honor the spirit and work of the Peace Corps by engaging in the Third Goal—promoting a better understanding of other peoples on the part of Americans.

This Peace Corps Week took place February 25 through March 3. It was a great success, thanks to thousands of Returned Volunteers and extended Peace Corps family members who highlighted the important work of past and present Volunteers through many large- and small-scale activities. As the coordinator for the Peace Corps Week program, I have been

continually amazed and proud to hear about the many creative ways our dedicated Peace Corps family has shared Peace Corps and their service with their communities here at home and abroad.

RPCVs have brought the world home on the radio and on stage. In Arlington Heights, GA, the Peace Corps Amateur Radio Club, KA9NLX, operated a live Peace Corps Week special event on “ham” radio to honor the service and sacrifice of Volunteers and to talk about the Peace Corps with ham radio operators throughout the country. In Minneapolis and St. Paul, MN, three RPCVs who served in Costa Rica, Kenya, and Turkmenistan hosted a radio show, sharing stories of host country culture and music that was also broadcast on the in-

ternet. In Baltimore, MD, members of the Shriver Peacemaker Program and University of Maryland-Baltimore County theater students organized a play about Peace Corps Volunteers in the Dominican Republic in 1965 called “The Only Americans Welcome,” which included a discussion with RPCVs who served in this host country during that time.

RPCVs have also organized large festive events in communities across the country. Returned Peace Corps Volunteers of the Los Angeles area exhibited displays highlighting their Peace Corps service and sharing what life is like in their host countries during their annual Global Service Sunday Peace Corps celebration. 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countries of service, exhibits of local music, maps, written information, and demonstrations of simple crafts, cooking, and local songs. Children received “passports” at the outset and collected “visa stamps” from the exhibitors.

American classrooms learned about Peace Corps service directly from current PCVs. Forty-three classrooms from twenty-four different states (plus one classroom at a U.S. military base in Bitburg, Germany) spoke with their Correspondence Match Volunteers from thirty different host countries during Peace Corps Week via either international phone call or video telephony. Most of these calls were recorded, and a different Podcast of each recorded call will be periodically launched on the World Wise Schools website under [Volunteer Voices](#).

Through the outreach efforts of RPCVs collaborating with Peace Corps staff, members of Congress, state governors, and many municipal leaders recognized the service of Volunteers from their communities in proclamations and official statements. Senator Lisa Murkowski (R-AK) of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee has stated, “Many people mistakenly believe the Peace Corps is only about helping those distantly removed from our daily life here in America. This could not be further from the truth. Volunteers return with a sense of accomplishment and the skill sets that are often desperately needed or in short supply here in the U.S. Volunteers have had to learn approximately 250 different languages and dialects, not to mention how to handle different cultures with dex-

terity and ease.” We received 49 official state proclamations during Peace Corps Week. Among these, Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger (R-CA) declared, “As men and women of action, these Volunteers embody the concept of public service as envisioned by President Kennedy and my father-in-law.”

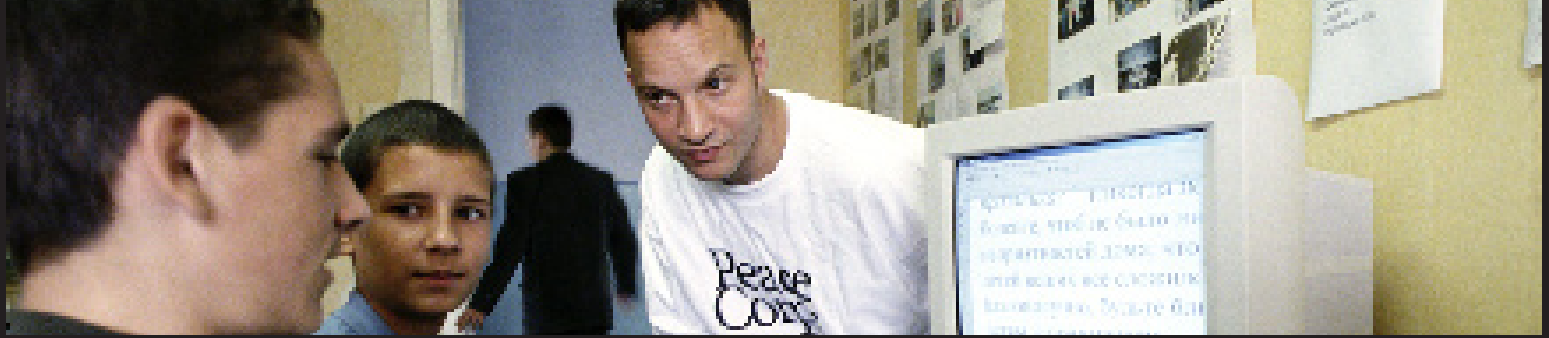
Overseas at posts, Peace Corps Volunteers and host country staff also celebrated. In Armenia, PCVs held community meetings to talk about the work of the Peace Corps. “The American Idealist,” a documentary that describes the life of Sergeant Shriver and first years of the Peace Corps, was shown at some of these meetings and was followed by discussions of Peace Corps goals, idea of volunteerism, and civil rights.

Individuals also celebrated the Peace Corps anniversary by writing to their local newspapers or being interviewed for an article highlighting their service and the Peace Corps. Many more RPCVs shared their stories through presentations at local schools, libraries, work places, and other locations. This Peace Corps Week, I shared stories from my service in Niger with my adult education beginning French class. I downloaded the PowerPoint presentation from the Peace Corps Week website and personalized it with photos of my service. My classmates, who ranged from college students to retirees, were surprised to learn about my experiences as a Volunteer and had many great questions. One even asked for my contact information to pass on to her son who might be interested in serving after he graduates from college this year. I went home afterwards on an emo-

tional high. It felt great to relive my service, and it felt great that my classmates really enjoyed the presentation and were proud of my service. It also felt great to represent my village and host country in such a positive light.

Although Peace Corps Week is celebrated annually around March 1, we can celebrate the spirit of our service any time of year. There is something great to be said about what we did in our two years (or more) of service, and it is especially true for those of us who have recently returned. There is no better way to readjust to life in the U.S. than to talk about your experiences with people who want to hear about them.
